SO WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE? AN EDITORIAL

I was privileged to attend a recent meeting of the New York State Association Board. It was an important meeting, as it addressed several key issues facing our state association, and indeed, the entire FCRV organization.

We are getting smaller. We have been for years. What does this mean for NYSA? The discussion was lively, thoughtful, and showed passion and commitment from those in the room. Yes, our numbers are going down due to the aging out of many of our members. Couple that with the fact that today's young people "just don't seem to want to join anything" and we are looking down the barrel of a double whammy. So what to do? A lot of ideas were floated; some were intriguing, and some were dismissed. One aspect that came out of these discussions was this: we want to *welcome* independent members of FCRV. It seems as though New York has a fair number of members who are not associated with any one particular chapter, and that's ok. You don't need to be a member of a chapter. This does, however, create the need for better, more frequent and more effective communication. And better communication will definitely be a plus for ALL members of our association. To that end, we MUST HAVE your email address in order to share this newsletter, and important news regarding New York State Association activities as it happens. These email addresses are NOT shared with vendors! They are kept private; believe me, I don't want mine given out to anyone who asks either! And if you do not have an email address we will still find effective ways to communicate with our members.

Another element to come out of these talks was the fact that we need to stop being a very passive organization and become more energetically involved in bringing in fresh members. It's time to hang up posters, send out reminders, and reach out to people who camp, and to businesses that support camping clubs.

We can begin by printing up Linda Austin's poster. (I'm working on that project over the winter.) Go to dealerships where we buy our rigs, get them serviced, or purchase supplies, and ask permission to hang these posters. Follow that up with hanging posters on the bulletin boards of state parks, and with permission, on the notice boards of private campgrounds.

Action is what is required to return this organization, NYSA to the vital entity it was 20 or 30 years ago, with hundreds of families, rather than dozens, in the various districts. Talking about how unfortunate it has become, or how sad, without action, is not going to solve our problems. I grew up in this organization and looked forward to camping many weekends throughout the spring, summer and fall. My kids did too. Let's all take a positive step forward in recruiting, or even just TELLING people, fellow campers, about FCRV. Invite them to the campfire. Share a pie or a S'more with them. Tell them what we do, and give them a brochure. We don't need to be overly pushy, just friendly and welcoming. Remember our motto: "Where strangers become friends, and friends become family".

Have You Heard About the Schuh Scholarship?

It's been a while since anyone has talked about the "Schuh Scholarship". What is it? What makes it so special?

Back in the day (when I was younger, I SWORE I would never talk like that!) NCHA, and later FCRV, would award scholarships to high school students who were entering a field of study related to environmental conservation. Slowly that field of candidates dwindled to a point where they were not awarding very many scholarships at all, so they expanded the qualification requirements to anyone seeking post-secondary education. Funding came in through contributions directly into the Scholarship Fund.

But the Schuh Scholarship is different. It was established in 1988, by Mary E. Schuh, a longtime member of NCHA and FCRV, from the value of her estate at the time of her death. When these funds were received, it was determined that the Schuh scholarship be given specifically to those who are actively pursuing a career in a field related to the environment. This scholarship has given out every year since 1992, with more than \$46,000 being awarded to students through the years.



New York State has been fortunate to recently have an applicant for the Schuh Scholarship. Amy Wittmeyer, a member of the Ken-Ton-A-Wanderers Chapter in Western District, is currently enrolled in Wildlife Management at the SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry in Syracuse (or ESF, for short) and was selected to receive the 2017 Schuh award. ESF enjoys a strong reputation for being one of the premier environmental colleges in the country. Everything, and I do mean EVERYTHING about this school is geared to some form of environmental education and training. Some of the majors awarded at this school include Aquatic & Fisheries Science, Bioprocess Engineering, Conservation Biology, Environmental Education and Interpretation, Sustainable Energy Management, and Wildlife Science, just to name a few.

In addition to teaching environmental programs, the school lives an environmentally friendly existence. Their most recently constructed building, Gateway, which serves as the Student Union for ESF attendees, is a LEED Platinum certified building, the highest level of sustainable construction recognition awarded by the federal government. On the roof of this facility is a



garden, open to students and faculty to visit, which includes native species plants, and sections of gardens aimed at varying research projects. Rainwater is collected, and stored in the basement of the building for reuse and recycling. Many other aspects of this building were used, developed, constructed and created to be as environmentally friendly as possible, while creating a welcoming setting in which to eat meals, enjoy fellowship, and shop, and provide office space for faculty and staff.



Amy is pursuing a degree in Wildlife Science, and plans to obtain the Wildlife Biologist designation. As part of her coursework, Amy has spent time at the Cranberry Lake Research Station, and the Lucky Star Ranch, both situated in the Adirondacks. While taking outdoor courses at these facilities, as required by her major, she learned effective and safe techniques for catching, gathering statistical data on, tagging and releasing a variety of fish, birds and mammals. She



also came face to face with a Pere David deer, which are extinct in the wild; one population is under the protection of the Lucky Star Ranch facility. The Schuh Scholarship has been applied to these courses and field work, and has enabled Amy to successfully pursue her education in wildlife management. If everything stays on track, Amy will graduate in 2019 and hopes to use her education to the betterment of mammal populations in the wild, and help build better interactions between people and wildlife, possibly through education of the general public in park settings. Amy has asked me to convey her gratitude, both to the NYSA Scholarship, and to FCRV and the Schuh Scholarship, in assisting her to accomplish her education, leading her on a path to her dream, making the animal kingdom a better place for its inhabitants.



Hudson Valley District would like to showcase the Shongum Shockers and their 50 years of awards and certificates. They are proudly hanging in their clubhouse at the Shongum Shockers campground.
