

Disaster Awareness & Safety Awareness Training (DASAT)

I am sure that by now, all of the campers are put to sleep for the winter. (And if they are still in use, good for you!) Just want to remind you to do a good job of making sure your fresh water lines are *completely* empty, including the toilet flush water supply line. Been there, done that, and had a water leak when I woke up the 5er in spring! Nothing that a replacement flush valve could not fix!

Winter time in Wisconsin. Ain't it *great*? Cold, snow, wind, yet makes you think of spring when the outside temperature gets back to 30+. (Yah right!!!)

Just want to give all a friendly reminder of to make sure your means of transportation is ready. Good tires? Engine anti freeze checked? Windshield washer fluid set at least -25? Got a can of windshield deicer? (Sure makes it easier to remove the frost!) New wiper blades? (Or make sure the old ones are in good shape) Got the snow brush? How about some warm blankets & a few candy bars just in case?

Now on to *one* of the topic's suggested that I investigate. *WHEN DO WE SAY ENOUGH IS ENOUGH? Or when do we hang up the car keys?*

I found in an *AAPR* booklet titled "Smart Driver" a section that has information to help decide just "when enough is enough". (We got this booklet when Judie & I took their 'safe driver' course last year. Besides the section on Driving Problems, there are many other

sections that help keep us 'old timers' up to date as far as safe driving. A good course to take!)

DRIVING PROBLEMS

There is a list of many things to (way too many to list here)' look/watch for' while driving to give you a 'hint' that the time may be coming to start thinking about 'hanging up the keys'. I will make a *short list here* but will have the complete list at our next BSA get together.

PHYSICAL CAPABILITIES:

Not being able to see or hear what is going on around on the outside of the car. Difficulty turning your head when backing up.

Evidence of warning signs

It takes family and friends (in addition to yourself) to realize and recognize that things are changing in your driving habits. The key is to be willing to accept that there comes a time to **hang up the keys**.

Wisconsin Automotive Museum

The Wisconsin Automotive Museum located in Hartford, WI is two stories filled with automobiles and related artifacts. The museum owns about 50% of the automobiles while the other 50% is on loan from private owners. In the museum lobby, behind glass is a rare 1932 Ruxton Model C Sedan and a 1929 Kissel Kar White Eagle. As you enter the museum, a working model train was setup with Wisconsin scenery that included homes, businesses, people, vehicles, and many items you would see here in Wisconsin.

The Kissel Kar Company is one of the main features of the museum and showcases the history of the Kissel Kar Company (1906-1931). Kissel Kar was founded by Louis (Ludwig) Kissel and his four sons, Adolph P., Otto P., William L. and George A. When production of the Kissel Kar ended, the company reorganized as Kissel Industries that made furniture (chairs) and outboard motors. Besides the Kissel Kars and US made cars, there are many autos that came from other countries around the world. Included in the museum are some early campers, Chrysler outboard motors, tools, tires (how they have changed over time), race cars, an airplane, a 1913 - 3001 steam engine train. An interactive engine model gives one a view of how the engine works. One display shows the different styles of tires has changed throughout the decades. Placards describe the autos/trucks and the artifacts of the time period. Some even include other information about the original owner/

owners or the artifacts.

We were able to view Dick Trickle's #90 Heilig-Meyers Ford in the repair garage and it was rolled out on the display floor later that day. Part of the display included his fire suit and items from his racing career.

There was a good member turnout for the November BSA gathering. After touring the museum, we went to the Mineshaft for dinner and Kip held a short Regional campout meeting. All who attended had a good time and some people even went exploring the city of Hartford after dinner.



Camping Today Updated Information

Dear FCRV Member:

As you know our national newsletter, Camping Today, is an electronic monthly publication. It has been one year since we discontinued the bi-monthly paper magazine. This decision was made primarily to bring our expenses in line with our income, but it also allowed us to double the number of issues members could receive annually. In order to accommodate our members without access to a computer, we agreed to mail a printed copy of Camping Today upon request. Approximately 100 members have been receiving the printed version at an expense of \$3.00 per issue (labor, paper, ink, postage). Effective, January 2018, FCRV will no longer be able to continue without recuperating some of the cost.

In July the Executive Board, composed of your State and Provincial representatives, voted to offer members only the opportunity to purchase an annual subscription to receive a printed copy of all 12 issues of Camping Today at a rate \$20 per year (25 CDN). The subscription will run from January to

December. The electronic version of the magazine will continue at no cost as a benefit of membership. There will no longer be any free printed copies of Camping Today.

If you wish to receive a printed copy of Camping Today beginning with the January 2018 issue, please complete the subscription form on the back (below) of this letter and return with payment or credit card information to the National Office. The magazine will be a black and white, double-sided printout of the online edition from the office copy machine. This service will be available to members only. If your membership expires during your subscription period, and you choose not to renew your membership, your subscription to Camping Today will end at that time, and there will be no refunds issued for the remaining months of the subscription.


