
We are excited as next month in May we have our first campout Mother's day at Richard Bong Rec.

# Program News

## Disaster Awareness & Safety Awareness Training (DASAT)

*Not too hard to talk about spring weather: two inch's of snow in Milwaukee on April 14th: Roads were slippery with more slush than pure snow: outside temperature around freezing, winds gusting to around 30 MPH. And we are the lucky ones! Just looking at the weather report from the deep south for this weekend, (Texas, Alabama, Mississippi and more) the tornado's are just plain devastating. Did you see the report from Colorado earlier this month? A tornado went through a R.V. dealership and tossed the R.V.'s around like my grandson does with his toys. One R.V. was rolling side over side bouncing off other R.V.'s like bumper cars. And we sometimes wonder why we are not safe inside our R.V. during summer storms.*

*How are we to be prepared for summer storms? Here are some suggestions from the National Coordinating Council of Emergency Council:*

*1. **Have a Plan.** The safest place to be during a tornado in **under ground**, NOT IN A R.V.! Do not be afraid to ask when you register @ a camp ground where are the emergency shelters are. If you can not go 'under ground' or a designated shelter, move to the center of the lowest level of a building, away from windows, and lie flat on the floor.*

*2. **Know the difference between a "tornado watch or warning.** A watch means "conditions are favorable for tornadoes to develop. A warning a tornado has been sighted, **seek shelter immediately.***

*3. **PLAN TO SURVIVE!** Be aware of changes in the weather. Knowing the basic skills of survival in the event of a tornado can help t keep your family (at home or away) safe.*

*What about thunder & lighting storms? From the 'U.S. Department of Commerce' & NOAA guide, thunder storms are relativity small area when compared to hurricanes, usually last an average of 30 minutes. We should consider **all** thunder storms as **dangerous**. Who is most at risk from thunderstorms? People who are outdoors, near or under tall trees, in or near water. ALL thunder storms contain **lightning**. Lighting is extremely high bolts of electricity, either going from cloud to cloud or cloud to ground. Lighting can and does cause fires, can (and does) kill people and animals, even split trees top to bottom.*

*What can you do to protect yourself and family?*

- 1. Know where you are. (Close by cities, county, etc.)*
- 2. Watch for signs of approaching storms. (Changes in wind strength/ direction/cloud color)*
- 3. Have weather devices, (cell phone, NOAA weather radio, listen to commercial television & or radios) near by operating.*
- 4. Know the difference between a 'thunderstorm watch' (Conditions are right for thunder storms to develop, stay alert about changing weather in your area & weather alerts) and a thunder storm **warning**. (When severe weather has been spotted in your area)*
- 5. Take necessary precautions to protect yourself and others. Do not try to be a hero!*



## Columbus-Belmont State Park in Kentucky

Just below the IL state line off Hwy 51 another find we discovered as our first stop heading to the Retiree Rally. I have this thing about a little off the beaten path one may find beautiful sights. We were perched up on this bluff overlooking the Mississippi River on a cool March Day. It was 20 when we left home and it climbed to 38 when we parked here. The sites shown have a beautiful view of the river but are sloped slightly down and not wanting to unhitch I took one next to the trenches of the Old Fort. The River was real high and the water getting to the park wasn't far from coming over the roads. The Barge traffic was at a standstill and parked along the trees on the river for as far as you could see. We had electric 20/30/50, water, and sewer and in our price range! This could be a fall campground with being able to see for miles and the colorful trees. The sites were all paved and level within maybe a 1x8 but some were sloped, and we found some that were just right. Sikeston, MO is across the river if you want to visit the tossed rolls eatery, which we took in last year.



## Lake Lincoln State Park in MS

Near Wesson, MS you will find this out of the way beautiful State park. This was our second stop on our trip to the Retiree Rally in LA. It has two sections one is semi shaded as you can see in the picture on the bottom. I was getting my steps in for the day and went exploring. I found a bridge to cross that gave me a sight of a couple huge catfish swimming nearby. I was then in the parking lot for the large beach area. No Life guards and there was signs coming in to the park “Beware the Alligators” so I’m not so sure I would want to go swimming. But, there were some folks walking the beach. I then moved into the upper loop of the campground and found lots of paved level sites in the trees. In the off season these with electric 20/30/50 and water ran \$16.50/night. Continuing down to the lower loop by the lake we found more paved level sights and I only seen one or two my unit would be too long. We were in site 64 and 66 but, 71-64 are very nice. They had electric 20-30-50, sewer, and water for \$30/night. The showers and laundry is on the lower loop and quite nice. They do not allow pets in them they have a State Law prohibiting it, it was a block bldg. and the only shelter from a raging storm. We stayed here going down and coming back the sites we had were just sweet. The rangers were also very courteous with information and accommodations. Try it you’ll like it.





## **North Abutment Campground in Grenada, MS**

Run by the Army Corp of Engineers was a wonderful place to spend some time. We stopped here on our way home from the Retiree Rally and boy were we surprised. We had never been to all these sites except one in the past so discovering these hidden gems was sure fun. Not sure if you can see across the lake but there is a 5<sup>th</sup> wheel parked along the shore line. There were a number of sites around the lake and not a bad site did I see. The grounds are composed of three separate area's built at different periods. The section we are parked in is the newest 2005. Section one is the section you can swing through as you enter the CG, it is near the launch site. All sites were paved and level with electric 20/30/50 and water, sorry no shots of those sites. Area two is to the left of my truck following the road. That has some sewer sites but they were all taken. Funny the Crappies were biting and the fishermen pretty much had them. This lake "Grenada" produced the largest crappie at 5 lbs. still a state record. So, yes I went in to Walmart and got a one day fishing license so I could try my hand at one of those. But alas only bluegills and catfish were on the menu that day. We stayed three nights here on site 83 it was great. I will (continued on page 11)

stop again if I am in the area, but will try for one of those sewer sites next to the water. The lake was running at flood level and had just come down from 28' to 25' yet they had to watch so the river below did not flood and it was draining into the Mississippi. There are 3 huge reservoirs in northern Mississippi and they are circled with Corp parks. Talking with some of the other campers many of them are the same as the park we were in, clean and neat. There is a State Park just over the levy and it had flooded out 10 days before we arrived after a heavy 10 inches of rain in the area. I drove thru the state park but it had not been cleaned up yet but there were many campers parked and pulling in to stay. Nope, I will take the Corp park across the road.

I have one more place we stayed on the way home and it was Rend Lake in Southern IL. It is also a wonderful park that opens early in the year. We have stayed there last year on our way home in April and again we had water/electric and sewer and being a Corp park we used our Golden Passport and camped for half price. At NA in Grenada we camped for \$10 a night. At Rend lake it was \$12.50 but, we only stayed one night. The guys said the fish was just starting to hit give it another few weeks and it will be prime. Lots of area to fish off the bank. Hope you liked the articles, found all these campgrounds on the app called **Campendium**.


