CAMPVENTION 2020

This campvention is being held in Brigden, Ontario. Our Canadian members proposed that the fees for this campvention be in Canadian funds. This was approved by the Trustees and the rate set at \$325 CDN. US members planning to register in Hutchinson for Brigden will need to bring Canadian funds. Because currency changes daily the amount in US dollars isn't certain but should be between \$240 USD and \$260 USD. A notice of this will be in June "Camping Today", but feel free to tell other members so they can be prepared.
