

#### Regional

#### November 2019

Well It has been a full year for us. I hope that all had a wonderful Thanksgiving with friends and family. It is hard to believe that the camping year is over we are in the depth of winter. This morning it was 10 degrees here in western Montana. I know that many of you have much more snow and cold than we have had here. Those of you in the Dakotas and in Iowa as well as Nebraska, and Kansas have had far worse weather this entire year than we have had in Montana. A thanks to all of you that helped with Campvention this year. Without your work it would have not succeeded THANK YOU.

Some of the things that we need to start looking at is how are your Chapters doing with membership and where do you see your chapter going in the new camping year with membership? Are you planning on recruiting new members or just staying at your current membership numbers? Do you have a waiting list? is the list more than 2 families? If you have a waiting list of more than 2 and have had for more than a year your Chapter should consider looking at helping a Chapter get started thus creating a New chapter in your area. Possibly you have a Chapter that is no longer active and is near the end of its race. We might ask why is the Chapter near failing? What happens to this Chapter? What do we do to help? Many have had very good luck combining 2 small Chapters into an active fun filled Chapter with a new name and a new start to them. Only you and your Chapter can determine the place you are at as a Chapter and where your Chapter is going to be in the years to come. Based on the latest membership report our numbers are:

Iowa- 66, Kansas- 131, Manitoba- 0, Minnesota- 3, North Dakota- 30, South Dakota – 18, Nebraska – 63, Montana- 3. These numbers reflect as Gain / Loss for the new year starting in July2019 as follows.

Iowa +/- 0, Kansas at - 2, Manitoba +/- 0, Minnesota +/- 0, North Dakota +/- 0, South Dakota +-1, Nebraska - 2, Montana +/- 0. The numbers show us that we are at a loss of 3 Families July through October 2019. The numbers are 317 for the Region in July and we are at 314 in October. We are in most cases falling dew to health, and death of our older members. I ask you again how do we turn this around? The answer that I keep getting is we must find a way to recruit new members. The big question is how do we do that? You and your Chapter will have to answer that. It is my opinion that we each need to recruit our friends that camp, take them along on a chapter campout and let them see firsthand the fun that we have as a chapter. I believe that there are other activities that work as well, I am a believer in RV Shows and I think that they work but not as well as in the years that have passed. Membership is up to YOU and is in your hands. What will you do with it?

Nebraska has set the date and location for Regional Campvention! Regional will take place May 29 – May 31, 2020 in York, Nebraska. We will be at the York Fair Grounds. Let's get the word out and go for a record number of Region 3 Families at Regional this year. Yes, it is at a different time of the year than we often hold Regional but let's be open to change as we as FCRV need to adapt to change and let's have an open mind and be willing to try out new ways of doing things. Change is a given and we must be willing to change. Nebraska is working on putting together the registration form and working out the cost that will be charged for Regional. Rob and Joleen are doing great job in putting this together let's support the efforts and make this a great gathering this year. I would like to see us make this one of the largest Regional gatherings we have had. We will only do this if we all make a commitment to attend and get together as a Region. I will be there and ask Will you be there? Some of the things that we are going to try to have is expanded games, crafts, chapter sales. I am planning a couple of training sessions for this year. I would like to have sessions for Field Directors, Chapter Officers, and we will be having a State Directors meeting. We will be having a Regional Planning meeting looking at the future for all members. We are putting together the FCRV programs as a part of our Regional. So, if you are the head of a program and would like to volunteer to help feel free to let Rob and Joleen know that you are willing to help. Regional is a time to get together with the friends you have made within the Region on a smaller scale and have the time to catch up on the friendship. I hope that we see you there and bring a friend and a new family along!

One last thought to part with is I have agreed to place my name on the FCRV ballot for 2020. There will be more updates to fallow as information comes together.


#### WANT TO BE A KCA MEMBER?
