



Field Director's Report





Seeing a mix of mask and plain faces. What ever your feelings are about them we won't get into that here.



None of my pots or pans were really bad so they cleaned up as well and I know I didn't use nearly as much water as what I normally use. All in all, I'd say this is a great product for campers, especially if you use real dishes and not just disposable paper plates.



As the parks continue to reopen I hope more and more can get out and go camping. In the meantime take care and stay safe.





sliding plywood top, and off we went. It held our gear really well, but the Falcon was barely able to propel itself down the road, much less pulling even a small trailer.

In 1964 a new Fairlane station wagon came into the picture. Two weeks after getting the station wagon, we were off on the biggest trip of my young life. Yellowstone National Park, and the Black Hills of South Dakota. As much as I love the Ozarks, this was the trip that gave me the desire to travel as much as I can, and camping is the only way to do it right!

A year or so after the Yellowstone trip my folks joined the Heart of America Chapter of the National Campers and Hikers Association. I was 15 or 16, and had a part time job. I didn't go on every campout with them anymore, but always several times a year. By then, they had a 14' Forester travel trailer. My favorite campouts with the club, were the NCHA state campout at Arrowrock State Park. In the middle to late sixties, I think that Arrowrock was the site every year. Sites were much different then, and Arrowrock had a lot of space, but if I remember right, we mostly just backed off of the road into a grass site for the convention. I can't remember if we

What FCRV means to me!

Cheryl & I have been members of FCRV, Pitch-"N"-Pull chapter since January of 2007. I, (John), started camping at age 11 with my family in about 1961.

My folks bought their first new car in 1960, a Ford Falcon and we camped, mostly in the Ozarks. Like most people in those days, we started with a Sears umbrella tent, and a pup tent for me. We went to the KC Heart Drive In Swap-N-Shop and bought a car top carrier. After almost breaking the windshield on the new car putting stuff in the carrier, it was back to the Swap to

sell the car top. Back several Sundays at the swap, my dad found a homemade, one wheel trailer that was about 4' x 4' and we were in business. Except when my dad started to figure out what to do for a spare tire, and found out the one wheel tire was not rated for highway use. After some investigation, and not finding a tire that would fit, that was able to sustain highway speeds, it was back to the Swap & Shop! After selling the trailer, we were on to plan "C". My older brother had been building hot rods, and a couple of 1/4 mile drag race cars, so my dad designed a small homemade trailer of his own. My brother welded up a frame, and for wheels, they put on Falcon front spindles, so he could carry just one spare for car & trailer. It was about 4' wide and 5' long, which was plenty of room for our tent and supplies. Plywood sides and a

had electric or not, but our Forester only had a porta-potty, so other utilities were needed anyway.

After high school, I joined the Navy, married my high school sweetheart, and came home in 1970. Cheryl, our oldest daughter, Amy and I went camping with my folks a couple of times, and enjoyed it immensely. After buying my first new pickup in 1980, I had a chance to buy a small slide-in, but not cabover, pickup camper. We had our second daughter, Jennifer by then; and since the camper was very small, I put in a sliding window in the front of the camper, and in the back window of the truck, so one of the girls could sleep on the front seat of the truck, and the other on the floor next to the bed. We really enjoyed our trips for several years. As the girls got bigger, and a trip to California on the horizon, I started looking for a cabover camper. I found one that didn't hang out over the back, or past the sides of my F150. It was an older wood based camper, and I soon realized that it had a lot of wood rot. We spent two wonderful weeks going to Disneyland, the Pacific Beach, and showed the girls where we lived in Long Beach and San Diego. Amy was born in the Navy Hospital next to Balboa Park, and everyone was impressed with the San Diego Zoo. I sold the camper for \$675.00, \$75.00 less than I paid for it after we got back. It just needed too much wood replaced, and my F150 was not quite enough truck!

Our next camper was a 14', 1971 Dell, about same size trailer as my folks had. We didn't have anything to tow it with, but our Chapter President David Gish's folks had two lots at Bent Tree, near Warsaw, that we could park it. I borrowed a company truck to tow it down there, and we loved going with the senior Gish's for weekends. (just like we love going with the next generation Gish's now!)

In 2006, we bought a 2003 Class A Hurricane motor home, and

at the first Kansas City RV show we went to, FCRV had a booth to sign up prospective members. Dorothy Duncan recognized Cheryl from meeting at KU Med Center, so we already had someone to camp with. We joined that day, and soon were camping with the Pitch-"N"-Pull chapter.

We have been members since January, 2007, and have enjoyed it immensely. In retirement, we sold the motor home, and bought a fifth wheel. Our first big retirement trip was seven weeks going to Alaska and back with my sister and brother-in-law. (Jim & Merilee Thoenen, also P-N-P members) We plan on many more chapter campouts, and cross country trips after the virus is better under control.

I have been hearing that camper sales are way up, as a safer way to travel, so we all need to tell anyone we know with a new camper to join us for our weekend excursions!!

National Campers & Hikers, and now FCRV, has been a much loved part our life.

Notice of Proposed By-law changes To be voted on at the Sep 12, 2020 Board meeting

Suggested change 1: Remove Article IX, Section 3

ARTICLE IX. Election of Officers

Section 3. No more than two (2) officers shall be elected from any one chapter.

Reason for suggested change: This has not been followed closely in the past 5 years. With only three active chapters there have been times when a single chapter has had 3 officers. If we keep this as a rule than we need to make sure to enforce this as a rule.

Suggested change 2: Remove "No officer may serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office."

ARTICLE IX. Election of Officers

Section 1. All officers shall be elected by plurality vote for a term of one year, or until their successors are elected and qualify. No officer may serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office.

Reason for suggested change: Officers have been serving more than two consecutive terms. This change would bring the by-laws

into agreement with our current practices.

Suggested change 3: Reduce number for quorum to eight (8) at any BOD meetings.

ARTICLE VIII. Board of Directors

Section 5. Any ten (10) members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum at any Board of Directors meeting which has been duly announced thirty (30) days prior to the date of the meeting.

Reason for suggested change: With declining number of chapters it becomes more difficult to have a quorum. Essentially all officers would need to be in attendance (6) State Director (1), chapter delegates (3) to comprise the required quorum. Very few non-affiliates remaining.

Suggested change 4: Change "Regional Director" to "State Director".

ARTICLE XIII. Amendments

Section 1 No part of these bylaws shall be revised or amended without the approval of two-thirds vote of the quorum of the Board of Directors, provided that notification of the intent to amend or revise is included in the call for such a meeting, and also provided that a quorum is present at such meeting and submitted for approval to the Regional Director before action is taken.

Reason for suggested change:

This would bring our by-laws in line with FCRV Field Manual. Page 33 of the manual lists, as one of the duties of State or Provincial Director, "Approve or disapprove amendments to Chapter or State/Provincial Constitutions and Bylaws before final approval by the Chapter/Associations."

Please let your delegate know your feelings about this proposed change as it will be discussed and voted on at the next Board meeting.
