National Trustee's Report. . . .

Dear Family,

As the pandemic crisis began, the Trustees decided to give a grace period on dues for all anniversary dates falling during April, May, and June. No member is being dropped during this time. All members will have until September 7 to pay their dues. Recently, the trustees reviewed this concern again. Our organization has only two sources of income. One is individual and

commercial member dues, and the other is our national rallies. We do not receive grants nor funding from corporations or foundations. Except for two part-time employees, the leadership of FCRV comes from volunteers. Your camping family is also a business that has ongoing expenses. We maintain a website to assist you in understanding our programs and ongoing activities. Insurance still has to be paid. Office expenses and employee payroll still must be met. All of this comes at a cost. The trustees share your disappointment in all the cancellations of campouts. Those cancellations involved our two national rallies which provide revenue to help keep dues lower and pay our ongoing expenses. Dues were last changed in 2016 and set at \$35 and \$45 CDN. The organizations does have reserves to use at times like these. However, we have over the past 10 years consistently tapped those reserves at the average rate of \$30,000 per year. The Trustees reviewed the dues and decided it is not fiscally responsible to do anything at this time. We realize there might be people who have suffered substantially during the COVID crisis. FCRV does have a provision to help members affected negatively by disaster. Please contact any one of the Trustees if you are in need of assistance. The trustees hope you will take advantage of the virtual Campvention which was put together to provide connection among our family of campers. Sincerely,

-am I acting lovingly or selfishly? (10:28-31)

-does it glorify God? (10:31)

-will it cause someone else to sin? (10:32)

We know that we are to show love in all that we do but this is perhaps one of the most difficult things to do under all circumstances. Perhaps choosing just one of these questions to remember when making difficult decisions can help us carry out our role as a Christian living in the world.
