

The fun, interesting and educational weekend programming was presented entirely by talented NE members.

Region 3 was honored that National FCRV President Gerry Pfirsch, formerly of Aberdeen, SD, and now living at Monument, CO, made time in his busy schedule to attend the July 23 – 25 Region 3 Regional! Our Regional followed the July 11 – 16 International Campvention; Gerry returned to CO and his job the week between the two Campventions!

Region 3 Awards at the 2021 International Campvention: My congratulations to numerous Region 3 FCRVers on their accomplishments and national recognitions during the July 11 - 16 International Campvention at Elkhorn!

Region 3 garnered 4 of 7 <u>Wildlife Refuge Grants</u> awarded. They go to Hall County Park, NE; Mahoney State Park, NE; Wildlife Hills SRA & Nature Center, NE; and Dakota Zoo in ND.

Three of the six 2021 <u>National Scholarships</u> were awarded in Region 3. Region 3 recipients include Kiley Johnson, Omaha, NE (\$1000); she will be attending the University of Nebraska, Lincoln, majoring in Elementary Education; Benjamin Moats of Ames, IA (\$2000); he will be attending the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, and is majoring in Mathematics; and Tara Mueller of Exeter, NE (\$1000); she is attending Wayne State University, Detroit, MI, studying Early Childhood Education.

Kansas FCRVers received the President's Award in the <u>2021 National Parade</u>, as well as the award for the largest float – a walking unit composed of 17 participants.

Morty, ND/SD State Director Sherry McGuire's rescue dog, received the "Best of Show" ribbon in the 2021 National Pet Parade; he was also named the "Cutest Dog."

Iowa FCRVers took top honors for the largest amount of tabs donated in the <u>annual tab collection</u> for the Ronald McDonald House this year; they collected and donated 39 pounds.

Toward that end he has asked states and FCRV chapters (with assistance from state and provincial directors) to submit e-mail addresses for the public to use for research and inquiries. Those published e-mail addresses for chapter contacts are not actually FCRVers personal private e-mail addresses, but rather generic identifiers (eg: ndroughriders) linked by Carl in the Office to those of the chapter contacts or administrators.

Carl is posting upcoming FCRV state, provincial and international events sent to him in a designated format requesting specific event information (location of event, dates, times, costs, etc). Event registration forms in pdf, png or jpg files may also be attached. Decisions on publicizing chapter events are at the discretion of the chapter leadership.

Carl also welcomes wrap-up event articles and pictures following events.

Coordinating with your Field Director and/or State Director, all members are encouraged to make sure their e-mail addresses are <u>current</u> and <u>correct</u> in the National Office files, so that e-mailed election ballots will reach them for Springtime national elections. National FCRV <u>does not sell</u> our names and contact information. The membership database <u>is not stored</u> on a server or Cloud storage, thus helping to prevent hacking.

As you approach family, friends and neighbors regarding joining FCRV, remember the *New Member Incentive* rolled out last February offers a 2-year membership for \$52.50, rather than the customary \$68.00, for a savings of \$15.50 for the new member. If a prospective member prefers to sign on to a 1-year membership, at \$35.00, they will actually receive an 18-month membership for their \$35.00, rather than the traditional 12-month membership.




