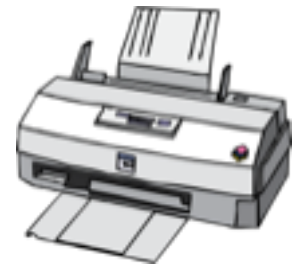
I have asked each chapter to contribute articles but anyone is welcome to contribute. Don't think you have to be a great reporter - just send the information and we can reformat it for you.

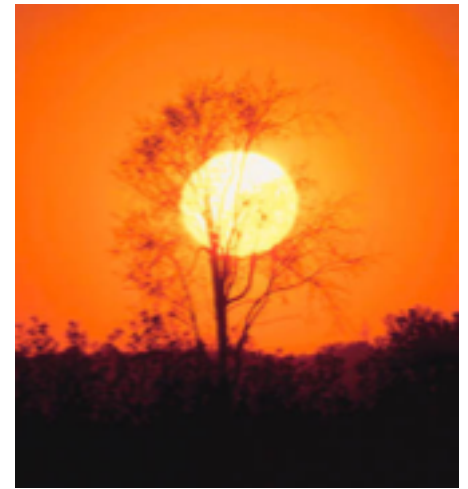

1. A chance to unplug. Yeah, we all love our technology, but once in a while we need to let it go. Stop trying to have Google solve every problem we have. Your smart devices cannot smell as good as a forest can. You breathe a little deeper when you’re in nature and that feeds your brain with something you can’t get from your phone or tablet.
2. Camping builds and strengthens social bonds. As you talk with people, you learn about their experiences, vulnerabilities, mishaps, and moments of joy. This enriches your life as well.
3. Nothing beats a campfire. It really inspires conversation. Some deep and soulful thoughts, that perhaps some that even your family are not aware.
4. Not to take everything for granted. Get caught in the rain, without power, and you may have to rely on basic survival actions just to make a cup of hot coffee or soup. It gives you a new appreciation for the conveniences you do have.
5. Reminds us our time on earth is limited. It helps us see what and who is important and guides us to make memories now so you have something wonderful to look back upon.
6. Living in the moment is GOOD. Yes, you may get dirty and smelly. Yes, sometimes the closest potty is that bush on your left.

9.  $1 + 1 = \text{more than } 2$ . If you’ve ever had to “do it all” yourself, you can appreciate that helping hand that comes from someone else who shares the burden.
10. Camping shows you that there’s more to life than just stuff. Don’t just make a living. Make a life.

- 1/4 teaspoon onion powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- In a large saucepan, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. Stir in the remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 8-10 minutes or until heated through.

## Backyard Conservation

Whether you live on a large multi-acre farm, or a single-bedroom apartment, there are ways of promoting conservation and wildlife that won't break the bank or require constant attending.

1. Water – Place bowls of water outside in shady areas but keep it fresh to avoid allowing it becoming a place where insects breed.
2. Consider planting Butterfly Bush in a pot on your deck or patio.
3. Hummingbirds feed on Begonias, Inpatients, Cosmos, and Snapdragons – all easily potted, and relatively inexpensive plants.
4. Put up a bat house. These creatures are currently suffering from habitat loss and environmental pollution and need our help. They are great insect predators.
5. Hang bird feeders
6. Hang bird houses
7. Want to go bigger? Volunteer to plant a bird and butterfly garden at the local elementary school. Get the kids involved.
8. Build a butterfly feeder
  - a. Place a saucer inside a larger plate in the shade and near colorful plants
  - b. Add a few low rocks
  - c. Add water, but do not cover the low rocks
  - d. Add over ripe sliced banana, orange, berries, pineapple, pears, etc. and replace when smelling badly.
  - e. Be patient

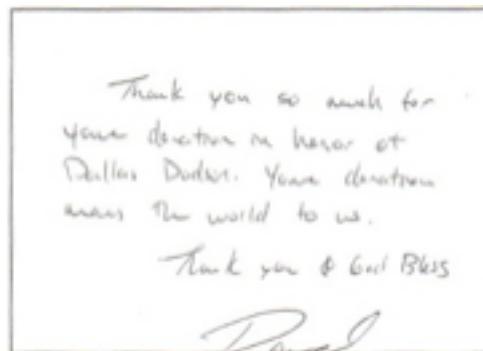

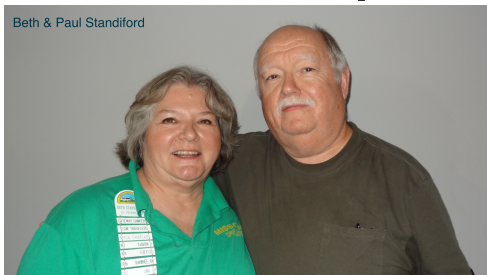

## Missouri State Director's Report

We have certainly been busy since my last newsletter article. Beth and I headed out on July 7 for Elkhorn Wisconsin - site of the 2021 International Campvention. We did spend a night in Chatham Illinois. From there we had an easy drive into Walworth County Fairgrounds. We had a great time. I met so many new people and made many new friends. (Isn't that what FCRV is all about!!) Even though this campvention was much smaller than any we had attended before I believe I enjoyed it more than the others simply because I am meeting more people and getting more involved. A special congratulations to Kaitlyn Musselwhite on being selected as 2021 FCRV Miss Congeniality.

And speaking of involvement - I want to thank Pat Crow for stepping up and volunteering to be MSCA State CAMP Director. Her contact information has been added on page 2 of this newsletter. I sure we can expect more information from her soon about the CAMP program and what it means to all of us.

Speaking of volunteers, there are two state program director positions that remain open. One is DASAT (Disaster and Safety Awareness Training) and the other is Conservation. Please contact me if you have any interest in either of these positions. I'll be happy to discuss them with you and get information to you on what this entails.

Other available chairman positions that remain open are Legislation, Historian, Awards, and Sunshine. If you are interested in any of these positions please contact MSCA President Carl Staas and let him know you are interested. The amount of time for these positions is minimal but the reward of getting involved in YOUR organization is great.

I need a bit of assistance with technology items. I am currently the only administrator for the MSCA Facebook Group and the only administrator for the MSCA Facebook Page. I need at least one additional person to step up as a coadministrator. I am also the only administrator of the MSCA web site. We need at least two administrators so that if something were to happen to one of the administrators access to these sites would continue.

Beth and I have started another interesting MSCA project. We have the minutes of MSCA BOD meetings going back to the first meeting in November of 1963. We first scan the minutes as a PDF file and then run it through an OCR (optical character recognition) program. This allows PDF file to be searchable. As of this writing we have scanned and converted minutes from 1981 to 1987. Current plans are to make these available on the MSCA website or possibly provide copies for any interested member via a thumb drive or a DVD. Let me know if you are interested in a copy.
