My deepest thanks to NE State Directors Rob and Joleen Baker, their Regional Campvention Committee and NE FCRV's for an excellent "Days of the Pioneers"-themed Region 3 Regional Campvention July 23 - 25. The fun, interesting and educational weekend programming was presented entirely by talented NE members!

Region 3 was honored that National FCRV President Gerry Pfirsch, formerly of Aberdeen, SD, and now living at Monument, CO, made time in his busy schedule to attend the July 23 - 25 Region 3 Regional! Our Regional followed the July 11 - 16 International Campvention; Gerry returned to CO and his job the week between the two Campventions!

***Region 3 Awards at the 2021 International Campvention:*** My congratulations to numerous Region 3 FCRV's on their accomplishments and national recognitions during the July 11 - 16 International Campvention at Elkhorn!

Region 3 garnered 4 of 7 Wildlife Refuge Grants awarded. They go to Hall County Park, NE; Mahoney State Park, NE; Wildlife Hills SRA & Nature Center, NE; and Dakota Zoo in ND.

Three of the six 2021 National Scholarships were awarded in Region 3. Region 3 recipients include Kiley Johnson, Omaha, NE (\$1000); she will be attending the University of Nebraska, Lincoln, majoring in Elementary Education; Benjamin Moats of Ames, IA (\$2000); he will be attending the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, and is

majoring in Mathematics; and Tara Mueller of Exeter, NE (\$1000); she is attending Wayne State University, Detroit, MI, studying Early Childhood Education.

Kansas FCRV's received the President's Award in the 2021 National Parade, as well as the award for the largest float -- a walking unit composed of 17 participants.

Morty, ND/SD State Director Sherry McGuire's rescue dog, received the "Best of Show" ribbon in the 2021 National Pet Parade; he was also named the "Cutest Dog."

Iowa FCRV's took top honors for the largest amount of tabs donated in the annual tab collection for the Ronald McDonald House this year; they collected and donated 39 pounds.

***Improving our Social Media Presence:*** Carl at the National FCRV Office has been working very hard in recent months to improve our FCRV social media presence. Toward that end he has asked states and FCRV chapters (with assistance from state and provincial directors) to submit e-mail addresses for the public to use for research and inquiries. Those published e-mail addresses for chapter contacts are not actually FCRV's personal private e-mail addresses, but rather generic identifiers (eg: ndroughriders) linked by Carl in the Office to those of the chapter contacts or administrators.

Carl is posting upcoming FCRV state, provincial and international events sent to him in a designated format requesting specific event information (location of event, dates, times, costs, etc). Event registration forms in pdf, png or jpg files may also be attached. Decisions on publicizing chapter events are at the discretion of the chapter leadership.

Carl also welcomes wrap-up event articles and pictures following events.

Coordinating with your Field Director and/or State Director, all members are encouraged to make sure their e-mail addresses are current and correct in the National Office files, so that e-mailed election ballots will reach them for Springtime national elections. National FCRV does not sell our names and

contact information. The membership database is not stored on a server or Cloud storage, thus helping to prevent hacking.

SCHOLARSHIP ADMINISTRATION REGULATIONS  
NEBRASKA NCHA/FCRV SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION INC

I. STIPEND

- A. Annual scholarships will be awarded based upon the monies available for dispersal at the recommendation of the Board.
  - 1. Each scholarship will be for one year with recipient having the opportunity to reapply scholarships each year the student is pursuing his/her undergraduate work in an approved course of study.
  - 2. Stipends will be paid at the beginning of the first and second semester. Recipients must SUBMIT TO THE SCHOLARSHIP CHAIRPERSON their class and their grades to qualify.
- B. Amounts awarded to the scholarship recipients will be determined by the Board based on the following:
  - 1. The amount of interest, and any other monies that could be used for scholarship.
  - 2. The qualifications of the applicant.
- C. It shall be the sole responsibility of the applicants to send their grades and their class schedules to the Chairperson.

II. SELECTION OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS.

- A. Selection of the scholarship recipients shall be made by the Board of Directors, provided there is a quorum present.
  - 1. Selection will require a two-thirds vote of the Board members present.
  - 2. Selection will be made prior to the Annual General Membership meeting.
  - 3. Scholarship recipients shall be announced at the State Campout every year.
- B. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS.
  - 1. GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS.
    - a. Applicants graduating from High School should have an academic standing in the top 40% of their class.
    - b. Applicants enrolled in college at the time of the application should have a cumulative B average or 2.5 average for their time enrolled.
    - c. It would be hoped, by the Board, that if a student is a full-ride scholarship that you would decline the one from NCHA/FRV so it can be used by a student who could use more money.
  - 2. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS
    - a. General maturity, leadership displayed, and related activities of the candidate are considered.
    - b. Candidate must be involved in at least one scheduled NCHA/FCRV activity. This includes special NCHA/FCRV events, such as June Bug campout, or State Annual Fall campout.
    - c. College students applying for the NCHA/FCRV SCHOLARSHIP must file all the following with the Scholarship Board Chair
      - 1. Official application
      - 2. Official college transcript

3. Two letters of recommendations from:
  - a. College teacher or administrator
  - b. NCHA/FCRV member
4. Photocopy of parents, guardians, or applicants' membership in FCRV.
5. One recent photograph.
6. All applications must be on file with the scholarship chairperson by June 1 of the year that the award is being made.
7. In the event the applicant is awarded a scholarship, the duty of applicant is to show proof of registration by returning the Verification Form signed by the school/university registrar to the Scholarship Chairman. They will then be awarded their stipend.

### III. INELIGIBILITY OF RECIPIENTS.

1. Ineligibility will be declared for any of the following reasons:
  - a. Withdrawal from school.
  - b. Participation in activities deemed by the College or Scholarship Board to be unpatriotic or contrary to the goals of NCHA/FCRV
  - c. Placement on academic probation by the school being attended.

### IV. DUTIES OF THE STUDENT

1. It is the duty of the scholarship recipient to send first and second semester grades within 2 to 3 weeks at the end of the stated semesters.  
Second semester class registration schedule as soon as they are available.

### V. DEFINITION OF COLLEGE

1. Four-year College or University
2. Four-year Community College.
3. Two or four year Junior College.

### VI. ELIGIBILITY

1. High School graduates.
2. Adults returning to school.
