#### Cowboy Baked Beans

Baked Cowboy beans are a perennial favorite at potlucks or barbecues. This meaty recipe uses a variety of beans and has a perfect smoky taste.

**Per roaster -**

#### **Ingredients**

**1 ½ pound ground beef**

**1 pound bacon**

**3 cups barbecue sauce**

**3 cans 28 oz pork & beans**

**2 cans pinto beans (rinsed and drained)**

**1 can black eyes peas (rinsed and drained)**

**3 cans dark kidney beans (rinsed and drained)**

**3 cans navy beans (rinsed and drained)**

**2 medium onions, chopped**

**½ cup packed brown sugar**

**½ cup molasses**

**3 tablespoons balsamic vinegar**

**3-4 teaspoons ground mustard**

**3 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce**

**2 teaspoons salt**

**2 teaspoons garlic powder**

**2 teaspoons pepper**

**Directions:** In large skillet, brown ground beef. Drain and set aside. Add bacon to skillet and cook 5 to 7 minutes, stirring frequently. Remove to drain and chop. Add onions and cook additional 4 to 5 minutes, until onions are soft and translucent. Add ground beef, bacon and onions to roaster. Add pork and beans and drained beans, brown sugar, molasses, balsamic vinegar, ground mustard, Worcestershire sauce, salt, garlic powder and pepper. Stir gently to combine. Cover and cook at 200 degrees for 2 - 3 hours until heated through. If seems a little dry, add water or beef stock. Serves approximately sixty.

### **Cubine Boots**

In 1876 John W. Cubine helped put Coffeyville on the map by creating a cowboy boot that fit the left and right foot individually. Before this, all boots were constructed exactly the same and didn't have a specific fit for each foot. Cubine's popular fit spread across the country, and he is known as the creator of the first left and right cowboy boot. John's nephew, George Cubine, and another employee from the boot shop, Charles Brown, were both killed defending Coffeyville on the day of the Dalton Raid.

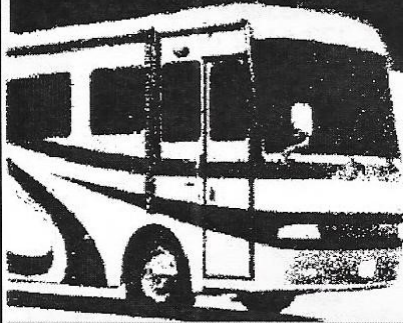

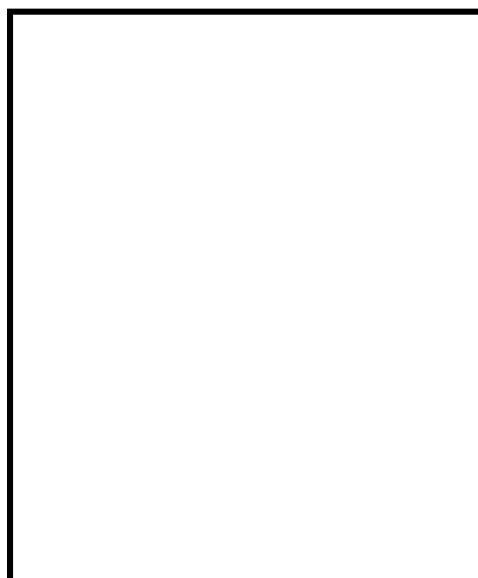

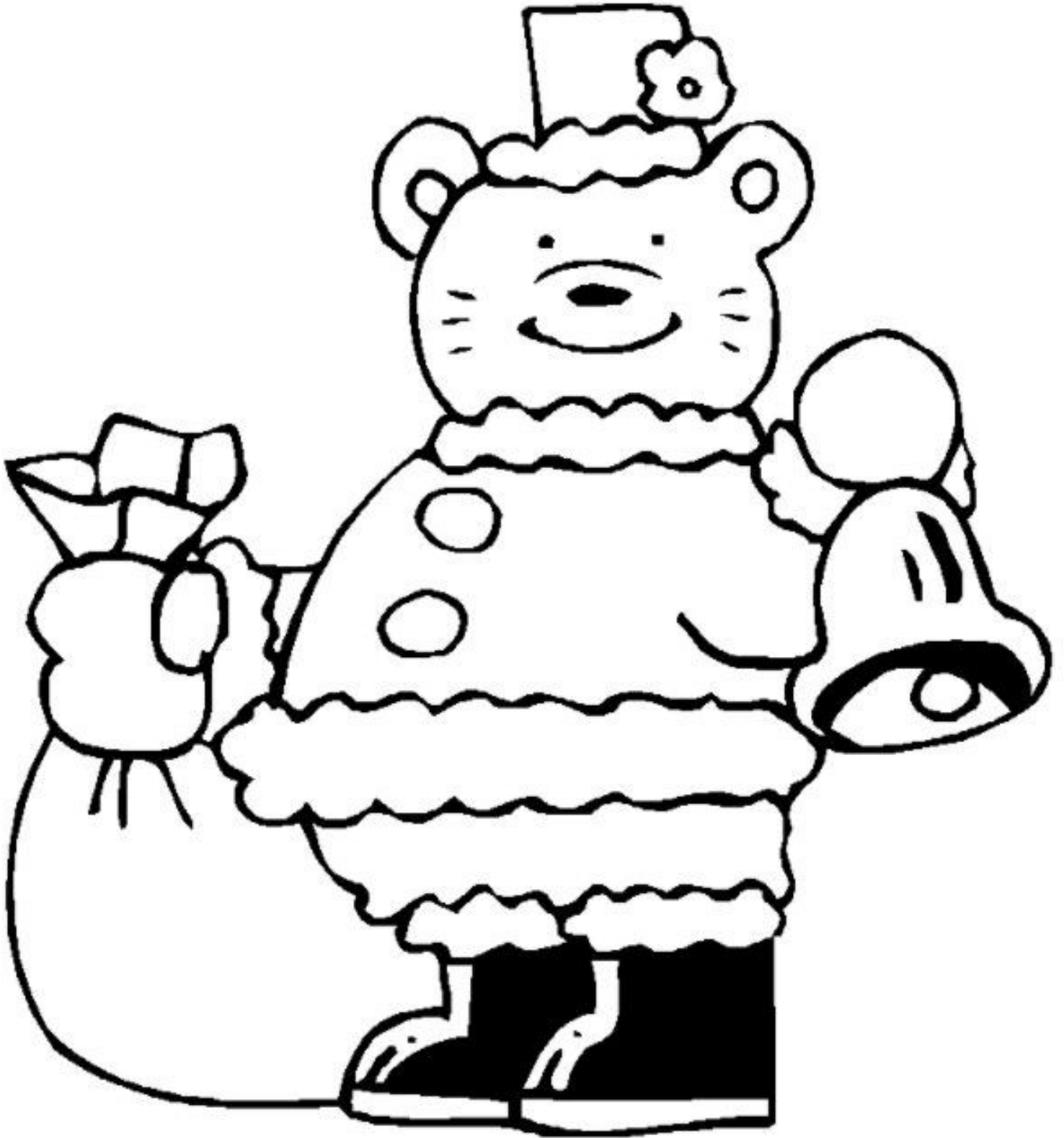
