### Finger Lakes District

The Finger Lakes District (FLD) has three active chapters: KK (Keuka Kampers). P.A.L.S (Partners of Allegany, Livingston, Steuben) and TOH (Top of the Hill). In 1972 there were about 35 chapters in FLD! These three current surviving chapters have a total membership of 17 households, with several being members of 2 chapters. TOH is a retiree chapter that meets/camps in the middle of the week, while the other two follow weekend schedules. All FLD chapters meet year-round having meals and meetings most winter months. These chapters have also recently given "Honorary Membership" to several previous members that are no longer able (age and health related) to be actively involved, following the established national FCRV guidelines.

We have a chapter rotation schedule for the hosting district campouts and coordinators meetings. Top of the Hill Chapter hosted the 2019 Fall District Campout, "Cornfield Drama", held at the Riverside Campground near Wellsville. We had very good attendance and were honored to have special guests Joe and Patty Wittmeyer, FCRV New York State Directors, there for the weekend. We all had fun with the "Corn" theme decorations, jokes and, of course, a corn hole tournament. Carolyn Heckman won the ladies division and Joe Wittmeyer won the men's and overall 1st place. On Saturday evening, during the music intermission, Patty and Joe presented the National Humanitarian Award to Christine Wheaton for her work in presenting Quilts of Valor to TOH veterans. This award had been announced at Campvention but Chris was unable to attend in July.

Each October FLD has a Recognition Dinner. In recent years a prepared meal has been organized by the district officers. Entertainment starts out with fun awards recognizing memorable happenings during the recent camping season. You can guess this leads to lots of laughter and embarrassment. Then we usually have some musical entertainment from an outside group. Our district officers do an amazing job organizing this event.
