## The Spotted Lanternfly Recap

I first wrote about the Spotted Lanternfly in 2015 and now we have some new information. But first a small recap of what the Spotted lanternfly is. It is a plant hopper that is native to China and Southeast Asia. It has been introduced to Japan, South Korea, and the United States. It tends to feed on grapes, fruit trees, and hardwoods. And we know that it could be very detrimental to those industries.

By 2016, it was no longer located in just Berks County, PA. It was now in Berks, Bucks, Chester, Lehigh, and



Montgomery Counties. We now know that the Spotted lanternfly's favorite tree to feed on is the Ailanthus altissima (Tree of Heaven), but can be found on other plants and trees. The females can lay between 30 and 100 eggs in the fall. It is not known to bite humans. At this time, in the US, we have found no predator or parasitic insect to keep the Spotted lanternfly in check. The Penn State Extension suggests to kill it as soon as it is spotted, and to report it if found in a county other that those listed above. (badbug@pa.gov or 1-866-253-7189).

If you are wondering why I am telling you about an invasive insect found in PA, it is because in 2017 it was also found in New York (Delaware County), Delaware, New Jersey, and, in January of 2018, Virginia. In February of 2018, PA Governor Tom Wolf placed 13 counties in quarantine (including the Philadelphia area).

So what can we do? **DO NOT MOVE FIREWOOD!** Check your rig and all camping items for unwanted pests. We need to be more vigilant. For more information here is a list of terrestrial (land living) invasive species found in NY: Emerald Ash Borer, Asian longhorned beetle, giant hogweed, Eurasian boar, oak wilt, hemlock wolly adelgid, Sirex wood wasp, gypsy moth, Viburnum leaf beetle, and the slender false brome. And we can now add the spotted lanternfly to that list.
