Message from the President



We'd like to start by offering late-Winter Greetings to everyone!! Hopefully you all had a terrific Christmas, and

the New Year 2022 finds you all healthy, happy, and ready to move past the cold and whatever snow has fallen wherever you're located. I think we're all ready for a warmer, better time to be out and about doing the things that now need to be done.

Presuming you didn't leave Missouri for a warmer part of the country this winter, your RV was stored away a few months ago and it is now time to be thinking about what is going to need to be done to it soon so that both you and it are ready for the travels and camping that is on your calendar for this year.

The first big trip for most of us will be the 50th Anniversary of the FCRV International Retiree Rally. It's being held at the Mineola Civic Center in Mineola, TX. The rally is to run from March 29th to April 3rd, 2022. Early days are set to run from March 25th to March 28th. And as noted in the past, you don't have to be retired to attend this rally. If you have some Spring vacation time available, you're good to go.

Shortly after you get home from Texas, you need to get ready to leave again for MSCA's own Spring Campvention. This year it is going to be held on April 29th, 30th, and May 1st. Like last year, it is being held at the Big Red Barn RV Park in Carthage, MO. As was mentioned in the Winter 2021 Missouri Camper, you can easily set your reservation so that you can go in a day or two early &/or stay a day or two later. If you are going to Carthage, consider

making your trip a bit more than the "official" 2 nights. There are a number of

things to see and do in Carthage and it makes all the effort to pack the RV and drive from wherever much more worthwhile. And speaking of reservations, hopefully you saw the email about Carthage that was sent out back on February 6th. From that email:

They have 24 sites set aside for us to be able to park and camp together. They have a deadline of March 29th (30 days before Campvention) for MSCA reservations to be made, if we want to camp together as a group. After March 29th, the group discount we are getting will be gone and they will open up any unreserved sites to be the general public. Reserving a spot after that, they will park you wherever in whatever sites they still have available. At the time of the email, only 9 MSCA members had booked a site for Campvention. If you're considering and discussing attending Campvention, it would be wise to take care of the reservation now.

Hopefully more than the original 9 MSCA members have now made a reservation to be in Carthage. Yes, it's an irritation (at least for us) that they require full payment of your stay up front. But it is something that Missouri does with all their state parks, and it is getting to be a common thing with private campgrounds also. If you're gonna play the game, ya gotta follow the rules...

Later in July, FCRV will hold their 62nd International Campvention in Pueblo, CO. It has been discussed and will continue to be discussed in greater detail each month between now and July in each issue of FCRV's newsletter, *Camping Today*. Registration forms are found in the back of each issue.

Have a happy St. Patrick's Day and a Blessed Easter. And we'll say it again. Stay warm, stay dry and safe travels wherever you might go.

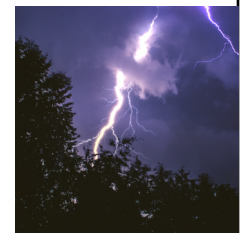

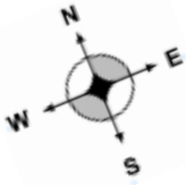

Feed My Sheep

“Sometimes you need an adventure to cleanse the bitter taste of life from your soul.” Unknown

And isn't that what camping is all about? Get out and away from the grittiness of life that seems to grind one down. You don't have to travel very far; just away. Sometimes you have a map and you don't. You get out in the fresh air and (hopefully) sunshine. You get away from your troubles for just a little bit. You know those issues will still be there when you get back, but you just need to lay them down for a little while to restore your soul (think green pastures and still waters) and maybe get a different perspective on them. Perhaps you need some campfire time with friends who really “get” you and understand what you may be going through because maybe they have or are going through it right now, too. A circle of friends around a campfire (even just 2 or 3 – “where 2 or 3 are gathered.....”) has a way of providing an intimate and warm feeling that gives way to trust and allows us to unburden ourselves to another. Sometimes just saying the words out loud to another is enough to lift the millstone from your heart. Ecclesiastes 4:9-12, “Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up! Again, if two lie together, they keep warm, but how can one keep warm alone? And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him - a threefold cord is not quickly broken.” And yes, our friends comfort us sometimes with just their presence, no words. One of my ordained friends once told me that he went to visit with a family who was grieving the loss of one of their own, and while he simply sat there, not saying anything while others came and went, and yet the family said it was his visit that comforted them the most because he came to share in their grief. 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.” Sometimes we just need to be reminded that He is always there to hear us, even when we are not camping.

The Lord has prepared you for the day ahead. He knows what it will contain, where you will go, how

you will get there. And you only have a vague idea, even if you think you've got it planned out. Spend time with Him. He will equip you for your journey. 1 Peter 5:7 says, “Casting all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you.”

Here's a little something to pass around the campfire with friends.

Friendship Bread and Starter

Starter:

1/4 cup warm water

1 packet active dry yeast

2 cups all purpose flour divided

2 cups granulated sugar divided

2 cups milk 2% or higher in fat, divided

Mix the packet of yeast into the warm water and let sit for about 5 minutes until frothy.

In a [glass bowl](#), mix the flour and sugar together. Mix in the milk and then the yeast mixture. Pour into a [gallon ziplock bag](#) and leave it out on the countertop.

For the next 5 days, be sure to mash the ziplock bag around, encouraging the yeast to activate.

On the 6th day, add 1 cup of flour, 1 cup of sugar, and 1 cup of milk to the ziplock bag. Close and mash around until all are combined.

Continue to mash around once a day for days 7-9. On the 10th day, your starter is ready for baking or gifting. Reserve 1 cup for baking, 1 cup for gifting. If you would like to keep the starter going, add 1 cup flour, 1 cup sugar, and 1 cup milk to the remaining starter and mix around. This starts the cycle over again and day 10 becomes day 1.

1 cup friendship bread starter

¾ cup vegetable oil

1 cup granulated sugar

3 large eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 ½ teaspoon baking powder



1 teaspoon baking soda

½ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon cinnamon

2 cups all purpose flour

2 ½ teaspoon cinnamon

½ cup granulated sugar

Add Yeast to Warm Water: Mix the packet of yeast into the warm water and let sit for about 5 minutes until frothy.

Mix Flour and Sugar: In a glass bowl, mix the flour and sugar together. Mix in the milk and then the yeast mixture. Pour into a gallon Ziplock bag and leave out on the countertop.

Day 1-5: For the next 5 days, be sure to mash the Ziplock bag around, encouraging the yeast to activate.

Feed on Day 6: On the 6th day, add 1 cup of flour, 1 cup of sugar, and 1 cup of milk to the Ziplock bag. Close and mash around until all combined.

Days 7-9: Continue to mash around once a day for days 7-9. On the 10th day your starter is ready for baking or gifting. Reserve 1 cup for baking, 1 cup for gifting. If you would like to keep the starter going, add 1 cup flour, 1 cup sugar, and 1 cup milk to the remaining starter and mix around. This starts the cycle over again and day 10 becomes day 1.

Preheat Oven and Prep Pans: Preheat oven to 325°. Grease two 9×5 loaf pans and set aside.

Prepare Mixtures: In a glass bowl mix the starter, oil, granulated sugar, eggs and vanilla together. In another bowl mix the baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon and flour together.

Mix Wet and Dry Ingredients: Pour the liquid mixture over the dry ingredients and stir to combine.

Fill Pans and Add Toppings: Fill the two prepared pans with ¼ of the batter, using half in total. Mix together the cinnamon and sugar and sprinkle half of it over the top of the batter in the pans. Split the remaining batter evenly between the two pans and sprinkle the remaining cinnamon sugar over the top.

Bake: Bake for 40-50 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out clean. Allow to cool in the pan.

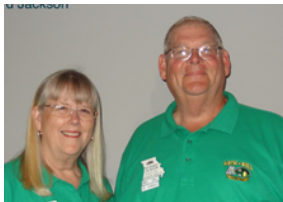

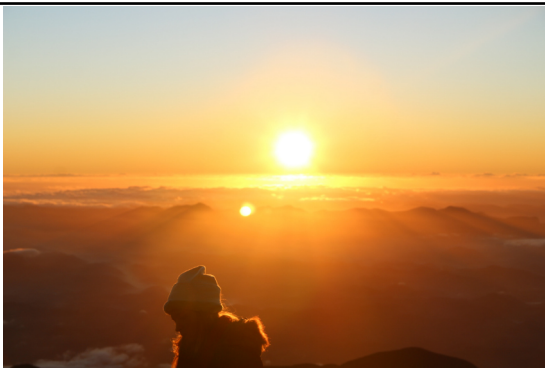
suspension. So, make sure to give yours a good look over.

Although our first official campout is not until April, I think I will take my new rig out the last weekend in March, weather permitting. Those wishing to critique my backing skills are welcome to join me at the KOA in Eureka. The new lever system to get the water where you want it looks to be a challenge as well. LOL. For those not wishing to unwinterize, you are more than welcome to come out, relax, and enjoy our fire.

At our first campout in April we need to decide on camping locations for 2023. Specifically we need to figure out State Parks as they open for booking a year ahead of schedule.
