This past weekend, an incredibly sad and tragic event took the lives of two children, 8 and 9 years old, who were camping with their family in southern Indiana. As they were riding in their golf cart, a dead tree was toppled by the wind and fell on the cart, instantly killing them while their parents, driving the cart, were not injured. I cannot fathom the pain that their parents and others who loved them are feeling.

When we are camping, we are at the mercy of the weather. Sometimes there is nothing that we can do. But we can take precautions that lessen our chances of being injured or killed during severe weather events. Today we will focus primarily on wind events.

The National Weather Service (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) describes "High Wind Threats" in six levels.

- Non-threatening (No discernable threat, sustained winds speeds considered "breezy")
- Very low (Sustained wind speeds around 20 mph, gusts to 25-30 mph)
- * Low (Windy with sustained winds of 21-25 mph or gusts of 25-30 mph.)
- * Moderate (Very windy with sustained speeds of 26-39 mph or gusts of 35-57 mph..."wind advisory")
- * High (High wind with sustained speeds of 40-57 mph, High threat to life and property from high winds.)
- * Extreme (Damaging high wind with sustained speeds greater than 58 mph or frequent gusts greater than 58 mph. An extreme threat to life and property from high winds.)

In "High Wind" conditions, small branches break off trees and loose objects are blown about. Isolated occurrences of wind damage can happen to porches, carports, awnings, or pool enclosures. Isolated power outages may occur. Winds are considered very dangerous for high profile vehicles and for boaters on area lakes.

In "Damaging High Wind" conditions, wind damage occurs to unanchored mobile homes, porches, carports, awnings, pool enclosures and with some shingles blown from roofs. Large branches break off trees and weak or diseased trees may blow down. Loose objects are easily blown about and can become dangerous projectiles. Widely scattered power outages may occur. Winds are considered extremely dangerous for high profile vehicles and for

boaters on area lakes.

The safest place during high winds is indoors. Postpone outdoor activities if a wind advisory or high wind warning has been issued. Campers, tents, and RVs are NOT safe in a wind storm.

Be wise in your choice of a camping site. Look for and avoid trees with dead or damaged branches. Before the need arises, identify sturdy buildings in which to seek shelter in case of dangerous weather conditions. If high winds are predicted, secure any awnings, dining tents, chairs, toys, or other objects that could be damaged or be made into projectiles by strong winds.

If you are caught outside during high winds, take cover next to or inside a building or sturdy shelter. Stand clear of roadways or train tracks, where gusts could actually blow you into the path of an oncoming vehicle. Make yourself as short as possible by squatting down or laying down on the ground. (Be aware that lightning can spread on the ground, so if it is lightning you should have as little contact with the ground as possible.)

Watch for flying debris. Tree limbs or dead trees may fall and street signs and building materials may be torn loose and become dangerous projectiles. Anything that is not secured to the ground (chairs, tables, planters, bikes or toys) can be picked up and tossed about.

Be aware of downed power lines and anything that those lines might be touching. Even puddles can conduct electricity. If someone is in contact with a downed power line, do not try to touch them...you will become a victim as well. If you are in a vehicle that is in contact with a power line, do not try to leave the vehicle and do not touch anything metal in the vehicle. If a fire starts, open the door without touching anything metal, and leap as far away from the vehicle as possible. Do not just step onto the ground

If caught driving in a windstorm, keep both hands on the wheel and slow down. Watch for objects blowing across the roadway. Keep a safe distance from other vehicles. Trucks, vans, SUVs, Motor homes and trailers are especially prone to be pushed or flipped by the wind. If possible, pull off the road and stop away from trees or other tall objects.

Have access on your phone or on a weather radio your camper to local weather forecasts and bulletins issued by NOAA or local media. Heed all warnings!

Recipes worth Sharing

SAUSAGE BISCUITS AND GRAVY CASSEROLE

Prep Time: 30 minutes Start to finish: 1 hour 8 servings

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 lb. bulk pork breakfast sausage
- * 2 tbsp butter
- * 1/4 c. all purpose flour
- * 1/2 tsp salt
- * 1/2 tsp pepper
- * 3 cups milk
- * 1 can Pillsbury "Grands" Southern Homestyle refrigerated buttermilk biscuits (8 biscuits)

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Heat oven to 350 F. Spray 3 quart (13x9) glass baking dish with cooking spray.
- 2. In 12-inch nonstick skillet, cook sausage 8-10 minutes over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until browned and thoroughly cooked. Using slotted spoon, transfer sausage to baking dish.
- 3. Add butter to drippings in the skillet. Melt over medium heat. Add flour, salt and Pepper: cook 1 -2 minutes until thickened and beginning to brown. Stir in milk and heat to simmering, stirring frequently. Cook and stir 1-3 minutes or until thickened. Pour gravy over sausage in dish.
- 4. Separate dough into 8 biscuits. Cut each biscuit into fourths. Top sausage mixture with biscuit pieces.
- 5. Bake 25-30 minutes or until thoroughly heated and biscuits are golden brown.




