Keeping an organized, decluttered home promotes safety and can help reduce your risk of **fire hazards** and **trip and fall accidents** on your property. Decluttering and organizing sounds easy. But making your home simpler isn't always so simple. Decluttering can be a very time-consuming, overwhelming, physically draining and even an emotionally stressful experience, but it can be done.

- 3. Get rid of old tattered linens and blankets. Oftentimes we accumulate so many of these over the years and they can take up a lot of space lying around the living room or in closets.
- 4. Organize your storage with sealable bins. Change out your winter clothes and holiday decorations with your summer clothes and toys from storage.

DEVILED HAM SALAD

Good to use for a sandwich, salad, dip for crackers or chips...a handy thing to have on hand for many occasions!!

INGREDIENTS:

4 cups diced ham (1 pound) 1/2 cup Mayonnaise 1 Tbsp. Worcestershire 1/2 tsp. apple cider vinegar Salt and pepper to taste

2 tsp. Dijon mustard 1/4 tsp hot sauce

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Use a grinder or food processer to finely chop the
- Stir together the Mayonnaise, Worcestershire, Dijon mustard, apple cider vinegar and hot sauce.
- 3. Add the chopped ham and stir until well mixed. Add salt and pepper to taste. Chill until ready to serve.



EGG ROLL IN A BOWL (Keto-friendly and very tasty!)

INGREDIENTS:

1 pound ground beef, sausage or turkey 1/2 tsp ground ginger 1/2 tsp. garlic powder 1/4 c chopped green onions 1/4 cup soy sauce 1 bag (14 oz) coleslaw mix (cabbage and carrots)

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Crumble and cook the meat in a large skillet and cook over medium heat until fully browned. Drain off excess fat.
- 2. Stir in the ground ginger, garlic powder, and 1/2 of the soy sauce.
- 3. Add the coleslaw mix and stir well.
- 4. Continue cooking over low to medium heat, stirring often, then add the remaining soy sauce as the coles w mix begins to soften.
- 5. Cook to your desired doneness, topping with green onions and additional soy sauce if desired.


