DASAT MOMENT

It is sad and almost unthinkable that this consideration has to be made. Yet it is more prevalent now and "a word to the wise" is in order. These recommendations come from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

An Active Shooter is an individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area; in most cases, active shooters use firearms and there is no pattern or method to their selection of victims. Active shooter situations are unpredictable and evolve quickly.

Typically, the immediate deployment of law enforcement is required to stop the shooting and mitigate harm to victims. Because active shooter situations are often over within 10 to 15 minutes, before law enforcement arrives on the scene, individuals must be prepared both mentally and physically to deal with an active shooter situation.

#### **GOOD PRACTICES FOR COPING WITH AN** ACTIVE SHOOTER SITUATION

- Be aware of your environment and any possible dangers.
- Take note of the two nearest exits in any facility you visit.
- If you are in an office, stay there and secure the door.
- If you are in a hallway, get into a room and secure the door.
- As a last resort, attempt to take the active shooter down. When the shooter is at close range and you cannot flee, your chance of survival is much greater if you try to incapacitate him/her.
- CALL 911 WHEN IT IS SAFE TO DO SO!

#### HOW TO RESPOND WHEN AN ACTIVE SHOOTER IS IN YOUR VICINITY

Quickly determine the most reasonable way to protect your own life.

- 1. Evacuate If there is an accessible escape path, attempt to evacuate the premises. Be sure to:
  - a. Have an escape route and plan in mind.
  - b. Evacuate regardless of whether others agree to follow.
  - c. Leave your belongings behind.
  - d. Help others escape, if possible.
  - Prevent individuals from entering an area e. where the active shooter may be.
  - Keep your hands visible. f.
  - Follow the instructions of any police officers. g.

- h. Do not attempt to move wounded people.
- Call 911 when you are safe. 1.
- 2. <u>Hide out If evacuation is not possible</u>. Find a place to hide where the active shooter is less likely to find you. Your hiding place should:
  - a. Be out of the active shooter's view.
  - Provide protection if shots are fired in your b. direction (i.e., an office with a closed and locked door).
  - c. Not trap you or restrict your options for movement.

To prevent an active shooter from entering your hiding place:

- a. Lock the door.
- b. Blockade the door with heavy furniture.
- Silence your cell phone and/or pager. C.
- d. Turn off any source of noise (i.e., radios, televisions).
- e. Hide behind large items (i.e., cabinets, desks).
- f. Remain quiet.
- 3. If evacuation and hiding out are not possible:
  - Remain calm. a.
  - b. Dial 911, if possible, to alert police to the active shooter's location.
  - If you cannot speak, leave the line open and c. allow the dispatcher to listen.
- 4. <u>Take action against the active shooter</u>.

As a last resort, and only when your life is in im**minent danger**, attempt to disrupt and/or incapacitate the active shooter by acting as aggressively as possible against him/her

- a. Throwing items and improvising weapons.
- b. Yelling.
- c. Committing to your actions.

# **Recipes worth Sharing!**

#### **5 MINUTE S'MORES DIP**

PREP TIME: 9 minutes COOK TIME: 1 minute SERVINGS: 8 servings (AUTHOR: Holly Nilsson)

This easy S'mores dip is an ooey-gooey no-bake treat that is ready in 10 minutes!

Ingredients:

- \* 14 ounces sweetened condensed milk 1 can
- \*  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups chocolate chips
- \*  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup marshmallow fluff
- \* graham crackers for serving
- marshmallows & chocolate squares for garnish (optional)

Instructions:

- 1. Mix condensed milk and chocolate chips in a small bowl.
- 2. Microwave for 30 seconds. Stir and return it to the microwave checking every 15 seconds until just about melted. (microwaves can vary).
- 3. Add bits of the Marshmallow Fluff on top of the chocolate and microwave an additional 15 seconds or until it is soft.
- 4. Using a butter knife, gently swirl the fluff and chocolate together to get a marbled effect.
- 5. Top with desired garnish and serve warm with graham crackers.

#### Notes

To cook on the stovetop, melt chocolate and sweetened condensed milk over medium-low heat. Proceed as directed in the recipe above.



#### DIPPING IDEAS

- \* <u>Fruit</u>: Apple slices, banana slices, whole strawberries, tangerine slices, or pineapple!
- \* <u>Sweet</u>: Oreos, shortbread cookies, ladyfingers, peanut butter cookies, & of course, graham crackers!
- \* <u>Salty</u>: Ritz crackers, pretzel rods, or even thickcut potato chips or homemade crostini taste great!

#### MASHED CAULIFLOWER

Ingredients:

- \* 1 large head cauliflower cut into florets
- \* 3 tbsp unsalted butter
- \* 3 tbsp sour cream (or Greek yogurt)
- \* 6 cloves garlic
- \* 1/4 c. Parmesan cheese
- \* Salt and Pepper to taste

#### Directions:

- 1. Steam or boil cauliflower until fork tender (10-15 minutes). Drain and cover.
- 2. Melt the butter over medium high heat. Sauté garlic until fragrant (about 1 minute).
- 3. Blend cauliflower and garlic in a food processor until smooth. (I use an immersion blender instead...works well).



4. Stir in Parmesan cheese, sour cream, and salt and pepper to taste.

(I usually add more Parmesan cheese that is in the recipe)


