I took care of this a few days ago. They have made some changes to their computer system. Nancy will verify the specifics of



your contact info and reservation to make sure everything is correct. And she does want a credit card number on file. Do this by August 15th, if possible.

Breakfast will be available on Saturday morning with members of Pitch 'n Pull manning the kitchen. After breakfast, we will have our Board meeting and then the General meeting. We will be discussing and then voting on where we want to hold the MSCA Spring and Fall Campventions for 2023. Check on cost, if they have 20-30 spaces available, if there is a meeting room (and cost), and whatever reservation deposit they require etc.



Booking Date: Your club members must call and book by August 15, 2022. We will secure their reservation with a credit card. Two to three weeks prior to arrival, I'll send you an email with the listing of the campers who have booked with me. Anyone making a reservation after that time is not guaranteed a site.

Price per camper per night: \$39.60 per night includes 2 adults, one camper, and one vehicle.

Additional Adult per night: \$3 each

Additional Vehicles: \$2 each

Clubroom: \$20 per night payable upon arrival from the wagon master or treasurer. It is your responsibility to collect from your members. You will then have access to our club room which offers a fully functional kitchen, tables with seating to accommodate up to 60 people with a charcoal grill and some seating under a large attached pavilion outside. **Sites**: Level Big Rig friendly gravel base, shaded and open sites, up to 50 amp service, FHU and pull through.

Picnic tables and fire rings are at each site.

Amenities: There is a three acre, fully stocked catch and release lake, (no licensing required), a large swimming pool (seasonal), half acre fully fenced in dog park, small gift store with necessities, large laundry room, handicap accessible bathroom and showers, free Wifi, firewood and propane sales. Do not bring firewood into our park!!

Location: Interstate 70, Exit 170 for Danville, South 1.5 miles on Highway J to campground entrance on left hand side. **Damage:** Damage made by campers to their site or the facilities is their responsibility, and there may be fees incurred. Please do not use outdoor carpets on your site as they may kill the underlying grass within hours. Refrain from smoking in any buildings on the property, and do not cut or trim any trees. Please inform the office as soon as possible about any defective equipment or damage you may find on the campground so that we may repair it in a timely fashion.

Cancellation Policy: Campers MUST call a minimum 72 hours in advance of their arrival date to cancel their reservation. Those canceling within the 72 hours or simply don't show will be subject the daily rate up to three nights due to a rentable site being held.

Payment: We accept cash, check and all credit cards. **There is a 3.5% surcharge on all credit card transactions.**

WILDLIFE by Beth Standiford


Summertime brings the chance to branch out with your bird food offerings. Here's how to go beyond sunflower seeds and suet, to nectar, oranges, jelly, mealworms, and more.

Sure, winter is a prime time for feeding birds—natural foods are less abundant and cold weather makes window side birding that much more inviting. But birds flock to feeders in summer, too—especially in midsummer, after they've fledged a brood from their nest, and they've got new mouths to feed. Summer bird feeding can bring you different species, such as Neotropical migrants that aren't around in winter. It's also a fun time to try offering some different kinds of foods. Here are some tips for creating a summertime backyard buffet that might bring a few new faces to your feeders.

Safety Tips For Feeding Birds Seed In The Summer

 Keep your seed dry. Hot, humid summer weather creates the potential for mold. "Some molds produce the byproduct aflatoxin, which is fatal to birds," Greig says. She suggests filling feeders

- halfway in summer and refilling frequently, instead of packing feeders full, so the seed sits for long periods. If you find mold on your seed, get rid of it.
- Move feeders occasionally. Concentrations of seed hulls and bird droppings under a feeder can lead to outbreaks of salmonellosis, a bacterial sickness that can affect birds (and people). Move feeders around the yard and don't allow waste to build up in one area.
- Put suet in the shade. Some packaged suet comes in no-melt varieties, but even these can spoil or become soft and foul a bird's feathers in high heat. Keep suet in cool places. Or, switch to a hummingbird feeder in summer.
- Clean your feeders regularly. Washing feeders roughly every two weeks will keep your feeders both attractive and healthy for your guests. To clean your feeder, take it apart and use a dishwasher on a hot setting or hand wash either with soap and boiling water or with a dilute bleach solution (no more than 1 part bleach to 9 parts water). Rinse thoroughly and allow to dry before refilling.

2 Thessalonians 3:13 "And as for you, brothers and sisters, never tire of doing what is good."

even after 3 years of discipleship, but he also quit on himself

Overnight Baked Beans - aka Taste of Home Brenda's Baked Beans

Ingredients

1 pound dried navy beans

1-1/2 cups water

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1/2 cup chopped sweet onion

1/2 cup apple juice

6 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled

1/4 cup maple syrup

1/2 teaspoon ground mustard

1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon salt

Directions

1. Rinse and sort beans; soak according to package directions.

2. Drain and rinse beans, discarding liquid. Transfer beans to a 3-qt. slow cooker. Stir in water, brown sugar, onion, apple juice, bacon, maple syrup, mustard and cinnamon. Cook, covered, on low 10-12 hours or until beans are tender. Stir in salt.
