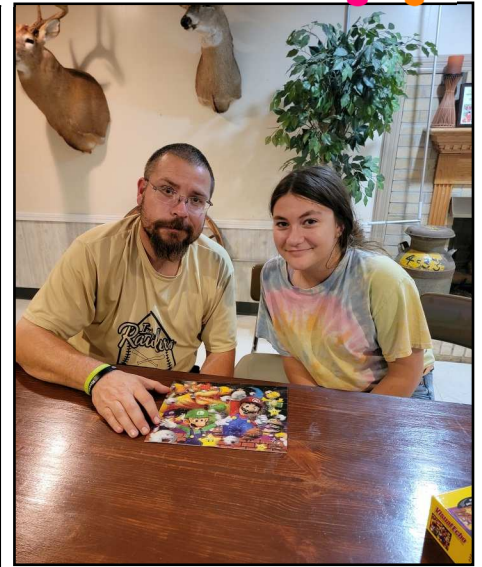
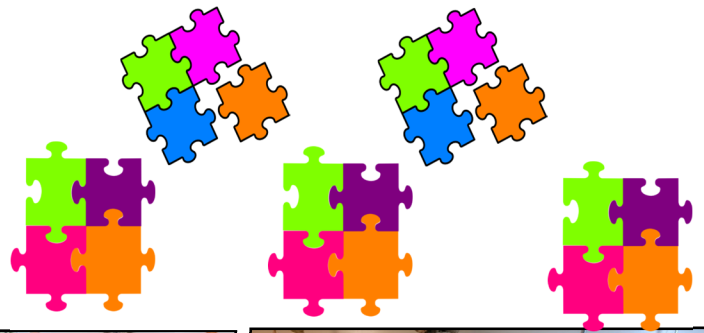
let me know. We attended many bordering state campouts when Fletcher was the National king! It's fun to visit the other states.

# Before and After School Safety...

## REMINDERS THAT SCHOOL IS BACK IN SESSION

Information for this article comes from the websites of the National Safety Council, INDOT (IN.gov), and the United States Department of Transportation (nhtsa.gov)

According to research by the National Safety Council, most of the children who are injured or killed in bus-related incidents are 4 to 7 years old, **and they're walking**. They are hit by the bus, or by a motorist illegally passing a stopped bus.

School days bring traffic congestion: School buses are picking up their passengers, kids on bikes are hurrying to get to school before the bell rings, harried parents are trying to drop their kids off before work. **It's never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when kids are present – especially before and after school.**

Drivers should be especially alert in these circumstances:

- \* Don't block the crosswalk when stopped at a red light or waiting to make a turn, forcing pedestrians to go around you; this could put them in the path of moving traffic.
- \* In a school zone when flashers are blinking, stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the crosswalk or intersection.
- \* Always stop for a school patrol officer or crossing guard holding up a stop sign.
- \* Take extra care in school zones, near playgrounds and parks, and in all residential areas.
- \* Don't honk or rev your engine to scare a pedestrian, even if you have the right of way.
- \* Never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians.

In Indiana, the following laws are in effect regarding driving near school busses:

### Two-Lane Roadways

If a school bus stops on a two lane road and the red flashing lights are activated and the stop arm is extended, all motorists **MUST** stop.

### Multi-Lane Roadways with NO Barrier between Lanes

When a school bus stops on a multi-lane roadway without a barrier and the red flashing lights are activated and the stop arm is extended, all motorists **MUST** stop.

### Multi-Lane Roadway with a Grassy and/or Concrete Barrier

When a school bus stops and the red flashing lights

are activated and the stop arm is extended, only vehicles behind the bus **MUST** stop. Vehicles that are on the opposite side of the barrier should proceed carefully, but do not need to stop.

### SAFETY STARTS AT THE BUS STOP

Your child should arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive. Visit the bus stop and show your child where to wait for the bus: at least three giant steps (six feet) away from the curb. Remind your child that the bus stop is not a place to run or play.

### Get On and Off Safely

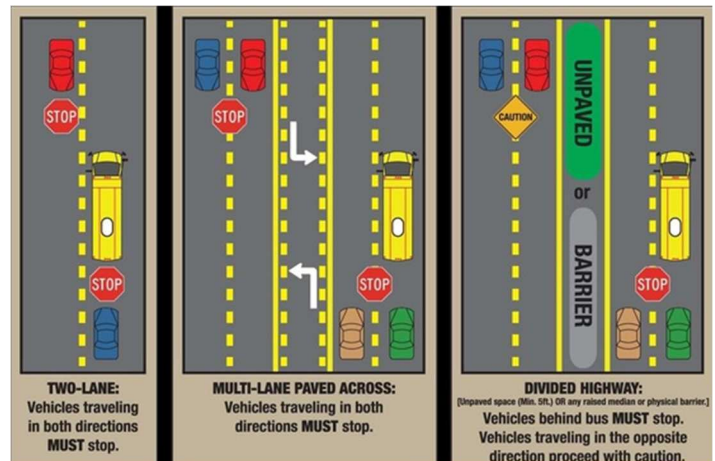
When the school bus arrives, your child should wait until the bus comes to a complete stop, the door opens, and the driver says it's okay before approaching the bus door. Your child should use the handrails to avoid falling.

### Use Caution Around the Bus

Your child should never walk behind a school bus. If your child must cross the street in front of the bus, tell him/her to walk on a sidewalk or along the side of the street to a place at least five giant steps (10 feet) in front of the bus before crossing. Your child should also make eye contact with the bus driver before crossing to make sure the driver can see him/her. If your child drops something near the school bus, like a ball or book, the safest thing is for your child to tell the bus driver right away. Your child should not try to pick up the item, because the driver might not be able to see him/her.

## ZUCCHINI PIE

### INGREDIENTS

- 1 c. zucchini, peeled, seeded, and cooked 10 min.
- 1 c. sugar
- 1 c. Milnot
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. soft butter
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 egg
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 Tbsp. flour

### DIRECTIONS:

1. Put all ingredients in blender and blend lightly.
2. Put mixture into unbaked pie shell.
3. Sprinkle with nutmeg and cinnamon.
4. Bake at 400 degrees for 5 minutes, then lower heat to 350 degrees. Bake 30 minutes longer.

### INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 c. peanut butter
- 1/2 c. butter
- 2 c. granulated sugar
- 1/2 c cold milk
- 3 1/2 c. quick cook oatmeal
- 1 tbsp. vanilla extract

### DIRECTIONS

1. Add butter, sugar and milk to a heavy-bottomed pan. Bring to a rolling boil and boil for 1 minute, stirring continuously.
2. Remove pan from heat. Mix in peanut butter, oatmeal and vanilla.
3. Use a spoon to drop the mixture onto a piece of parchment or waxed paper. Allow to cool until firm.

### SAFE DRIVING PRACTICES:

- \* When backing out of a driveway or leaving a garage, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school.
- \* When driving in neighborhoods with school zones, watch out for young people who may be thinking about getting to school, but may not be thinking of getting there safely.
- \* Slow down. Watch for children walking in the street, especially if there are no sidewalks in neighborhood.
- \* Watch for children playing and congregating near bus stops.
- \* Be alert. Children arriving late for the bus may dart into the street without looking for traffic.
- \* Learn and obey the school bus laws in your state, as well as the "flashing signal light system" that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions:

### Yellow flashing lights

indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.

### Red flashing lights and extended stop arms

indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop-arm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

There has been a tragic increase in the number of violent incidents occurring in our schools. Of course we should do all we can to keep our children safe when they are attending classes. But it is also important that we assure that they get there and home again safely. A moment of inattention or distraction can result in an unspeakable tragedy. It is up to each of us to do what we can that it doesn't happen.
