One thing we all experienced was the extremely warm temperatures everywhere and we hope everyone has survived the heat and are getting ready for some Fall activities. We have some updates to share:

From the Dusters: "Verne Ratcliff has had a lot of health issues and could use some encouraging notes. He learned in May that he would have to go on dialysis, then several other issues happened putting him in ICU for several days, followed by going to rehab for several weeks. He is currently taking the training for home dialysis and hoping that he might be able to do a few things around home and Onaga again. He currently has Home Health Care to help with some of the adjustments. He shared a couple days ago that it doesn't look like he will be able to go camping for a while. His address is: P.O. Box 314, Onaga, KS 66521." In visiting with Verne he has had to give up all his activities for a while and is hoping things will get better. We're keeping him in our prayers.
