Apparently they were waiting for the same space we were presently occupying because they were having their rally there the following week. Some of our members started talking to their members and we learned that they had been sponsored by Starcraft, manufacturers of RVs. However, the sponsorship was being withdrawn, and FFCC was unsure of their future. Their folks talked to our folks, and in July of 2022 FFCC became a nationally chartered chapter of FCRV.

All the interested members of FFCC joined FCRV and are fully vested in their membership and can enjoy all the benefits that FCRV membership has to offer. They are not required to join local chapters but can join if they choose. Here in Western New York there are 3 members of the FFCC chapter, the NY Bluebirds. They have all joined FCRV and are interested in joining us for campouts and events.

We should make every effort to make them feel welcome with the hope that eventually they become dues paying members of the club. Just like our own members, they can camp alone if they choose, or they can join our activities. On the State level, they will be considered Independents until they elect to become affiliated with NYSA by paying \$2.00 per family.

When the Thundering Herd disbanded a couple of years ago, Ken-Ton and the Fiddlers Green chapter became the only remaining chapters in WNY. We occasionally camp with Fiddlers Green, and they will be joining us at our June campout next year at Sprague Brook. Unfortunately, because they are composed of all retired families, they like to camp during the week, while campgrounds are quieter. This makes it difficult to camp with them, but we are still welcome to attend their campouts if we want to.
