interest is MSCA's 2023 Spring Campvention. It is going to run from May 5 -7, 2023. It will be held at The Great Escape RV Park and Campground in Higginsville, MO. Last week, I sent out an email to all MSCA members. It has information about registration, site pricing. deposits, and a link to the Great Escape website. Basically, if you want to camp with us next May and be guaranteed a spot, you need to put down a 1night's deposit by the end of next month. December 31, 2022. After that, I was told that they may or may not have a space for you. You have until the end of March to cancel your reservation if it turns out that you can't camp with us. Call them at (660)-584-2649 to make your reservation and take care of this soon.

MSCA's Fall Campvention for 2023 will be held on the 2nd weekend following Labor Day. September 15, 16, and 17, 2023. It will again be held at Lazy Day Campground in Danville, MO. As I've said in prior messages, if you have the time, you can easily set your reservation to go in a day or two early &/or stay a day or two later at either campground. If you're going to be with us at either Campvention, consider making your trip more than the scheduled 2 nights. A bit longer trip makes all the work of loading and prepping the RV and driving from wherever all the more worthwhile.

New Business – Spring Campvention 2023 location.

Paul Standiford said that last year it was voted that the Spring Campvention would be the first full weekend in May and Fall would be first weekend after Labor Day. He asked we reconsider the Fall date because the last several years the St. Charles RV show coincides with that date. I would like to have a booth there. Don Hopkins made the motion to come back to Lazy Day for the Fall Campvention. Mar Croxton seconded the motion. Voting delegates passed the

Frances Jackson wants to establish locations for 2024 Spring & Fall Campventions. Paul Standiford recommended electronically voting for locations. Frances Jackson moved to decide the 2024 Spring & Fall Campventions electronically. Don Toliver seconded. Discussion as to how to do followed: 1st

step, determine sites. Sending an e-mail asking for recommendations for both. 2nd step, sending an e-mail to all with those suggestions so they can do their own research on those locations. 3rd, send out a Google-vote. Don Hopkins pointed out that voting electronically may require 100% participation. As many people were leaving the meeting prior to its being adjourned, the issue gained no further traction.

President David Gish adjourned the meeting.

Christmas Cookies

Along with all the demands of the Christmas season, shop and find those perfect gifts, wrap them, maybe even get them off to the Post Office, grocery shopping as you try to

remember what everyone loves/hates, decorating the outside of the house (in hopefully sunny weather and not when it's belting out a blizzard), and all the decorations that go on the inside of the house, and let's not forget sending out Christmas cards and possibly even writing the annual Christmas letter which should be full of positive platitudes and just a little bragging along with pictures of the perfect family and the dog, then along comes the requirement of baking Christmas cookies.

Whew! I'm exhausted already! How DID those cookies get to be so important during the Christmas season? Perhaps you already knew that the practice of putting cookies out for Santa began in the 1930's during the Depression, as parents tried to instill a sense of thankfulness in their children. Some even left carrots or apples for the reindeer. Decorating cookies with frosting or icing began in the 1600's when bakers used a mixture of sugar and egg whites which, when cooled, looked like ice. Today's buttercream frosting is popular due to its flexibility

and come in a wide variety of colors. Shaped cookies started with Queen Elizabeth I when she decided to have gingerbread made to look like her honored guests and tin cookie cutters made quicker work of providing the shape of a person. And exchanging cookies with neighbors and friends is thought to have started in the US in the early 17th century when they were made to show kindness and gratitude toward each other.

Christmas sugar cookies come in a wide variety of sizes and shapes. One is the popular Christmas tree. Symbolic of the birth and resurrection of Christ, the "evergreen" is viewed as a symbol of immortality as well as the crown of thorns. We decorate the cookie with "lights" to help us remember that Jesus is the light of the world. Another popular shape is the star, which reminds us of the Star of Bethlehem as seen by shepherds and wise men. Bells are yet another popular shape as they ring out the joyous news of our Savior's birth. Candy cane shapes are popular as when turned upside down becomes a "J" for you guessed it! Jesus! The angel is another very popular shape and not just because it's usually the biggest cookie, but help us remember the message they brought to the shepherds on the night of His birth. Even the simple round ones, decorated as a wreath, give a representation of eternal life. Many other shapes are popular that have absolutely nothing to do with the birth of Christ and simply reflect the change in the season or secular events, but nonetheless, express love for our family as we bake them.

Whether you bake cookies or buy them, just serving them out of the package can be an act of love and that's what the season is all about. Love. "For God so loved the world, that he sent His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life." John 3:16 Wishing you love, not just this holiday season, but always.

Christmas Sugar Cookies

1 cup butter (softened but not runny)

1 cup white sugar

½ tsp almond extract

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 egg

½ tsp salt

2 tsp baking powder

3 cups sifted flour

Cream together butter and sugar. Add in extracts and egg. Then add salt, baking powder mixing well.

Slowly add in flour. Dough should be thick and sticky. Turn out onto a floured surface, and roll out evenly about 3/8" thick. Cut out cookies and place on sheet. Place in the freezer for 10 minutes and immediately put into at 350° oven for 6-8 minutes. Be aware that cookies will not brown.

Royal Icing

4 tsp light corn syrup ½ tsp vanilla

2 cups powdered sugar

6 tsp milk

Blend all ingredients. May be split up after mixing to allow for some different food coloring options. This consistency will "flood" the cookie surface. For thicker icing, add more powdered sugar. The icing will set shiny and firm, then cookies will be stackable.




