As we emerge on the "Fall-side" of our annual Labor Day weekend, we in Region 3 face the waning days of our camping season in the Heartland. We've been blessed to have been afforded numerous chapter, district, state, regional and international camping opportunities this (post-COVID) season!

My deepest thanks to the Aberdeen (SD) Night Owls, especially 2022 Regional Campvention Co-Chairs Ron Dietz and Gary Eldevik, along with their committee and other North and South Dakota FCRVers, for the excellent Region 3 Regional Campvention August 5 - 7 at Aberdeen.

Region 3 was honored to host 2022 National Retiree King and Queen, Steve and Diane Hitchens of Topeka, KS throughout the weekend. The weekend programming was highlighted by a first aid presentation, gnome tree ornament craft, CAMP hikes, a 2-hour tour of the Glacial Lakes Energy Ethanol plant at Mina, SD, Saturday evening group dinner at Lake Mina, and a Sunday morning "Prayers and Pancakes" send-off.

Region 3 Awards at the 2022 International Campvention: My congratulations to numerous Region 3 FCRVers on their achievements and national recognitions during the July 10 - 15 International Campvention at Pueblo!

Kansas State Directors Earl and Ivalee Vanderhoff received the FCRV Plaque, FCRV's highest award for volunteers, for their outstanding service to FCRV. Vern and Pam Failor, also of Kansas, received the Citation, the organization's second highest award.

Region 3 garnered 2 of the 5 National Wildlife Refuge Grants awarded. Schramm Educational Center, NE, consisting of four state parks, received \$1,000 for the Nebraska Naturalist program, focusing on habitats and adaptations of Nebraska snake species. The Dakota Zoo in Bismarck, ND, received \$750 designated to providing costly medications and daily vitamins for the newest Zoo residents, nine African Black Penguins, that arrived last September 2021.

One of four 2022 national scholarships was awarded in Region 3. Tara Mueller of Exeter, Nebraska received a \$1,500 scholarship award.

Kansas FCRVers received the award for the Best Walking unit in the 2022 National Parade. In addition to my congratulations to the Kansas FCRVers, I extend special thanks to National Parade Co-Chair Vern Failor of Kansas, for co-chairing the parade for Region 1. Special thanks, too, to Parade Marshal Rob Baker of Nebraska for assisting with the parade.

Region 3 had 2 first place winners in the 2022 National Conservation Poster Contest. Ellinor Smith of Kansas received first place on her poster entry in the 0 - 5 year age category, while Conner Smith, KS, received a first place ribbon in the 6 - 8 year age category.

Region 3 FCRVers also brought back high honors in several adult sports competitions. Marty Mashek, KS, received 1st place honors in cornhole. John Denisar, KS, took 2nd place in washer toss. Together, Mashek and Denisar took 2nd place in doubles washer toss. Becky Andrews, also of Kansas, took 1st place in ladder golf. Four Kansas teens, Conner Black, Rylie Ward, Ember Wyant, and Hunter Wyant, also won 1st or 2nd place ribbons in teen cornhole competition and/or volleyball or softball games.

The Campfire Campers Chapter, of Kansas, was awarded first place among chapters donating the proceeds from collecting the most pop tops (19 pounds) in the annual tab collection.

My deepest thanks to Auctioneer Extraordinaire Rob Baker, NE, for his entertaining and profitable auction antics during the International Campvention, raising \$525 from a huge and amazing Canadian gift basket, with the proceeds being designated for the national

wildlife fund. He also auctioned off numerous bird houses, with the additional proceeds also going to the national wildlife fund.

Thanks to all of the Region 3 FCRVers that attended the 2022 International Campvention, participated in the various events/programs, and made the Heartland Region look good on the national landscape!

Improving our Social Media Presence: As you know, Carl Fromholzer at the National FCRV Office has spent hundreds of hours (many volunteer hours, like the rest of us!) in the past year working at improving our FCRV social media presence. With the help of FCRV chapters around the US and Canada, along with the guidance of state and provincial directors, he has collected many -- though not all -- chapter g-mail addresses for the public to use for research and inquiries. Those published e-mail addresses for chapter contacts are not actually FCRVers' personal private e-mail addresses, but rather generic identifiers (eg: ndroughriders) designated by chapter contacts or administrators and linked by Carl in the office.

Our National Trustees have asked, even pleaded, that we all submit those g-mail addresses. We are also being asked to finalize our club outings for the 2023 camping season, and set the dates and locations for our 2023 chapter, district, state and regional campventions (Kansas is hosting in 2023) by January 1, 2023, AND submit a list of those events on the designated form to Carl, also by January 1. Photographs and campvention registration forms may also be attached in pdf, png or jpg files.

Carl also urges us to submit wrap-up event articles and (up to 4) photographs following events. Those, again, accompany a special "event recap" form. I've seen a few recaps from Region 3 states, but would love to see more!

All of this effort, on our part as well as that of Carl and our National Trustees, is to show the browsing public who we are and what we do, with the end result being improved visibility and consequently improved recruitment numbers! Please take a few minutes to post your clubs' and states' fun camping times together!

Speaking of member recruitment, remember the New Member Incentive offers an additional 6 months of free membership when new members sign on for 12, 24 or 36 months. The incentive does not apply to former FCRV members unless they have been away from FCRV for 5 years or more.

Save the Dates! As we wind down the current camping season and begin planning for the 2023 season, mark your calendars for special events already announced -- and check the FCRV website periodically for additions! The 2023 International Campvention will be held July 9 - 15, 2023, at Richmond, IND. The dates and location of the 2023 **Region 3** Regional Campvention are to be determined by host state Kansas. The 2023 National Retiree Rally will be held at Dothan, AL March 28 - April 3, 2023. Pre-registration forms for the International Campvention and National Retiree Rally are available in *Camping Today* and on the national website, fcrv.org.

Come one – Come all

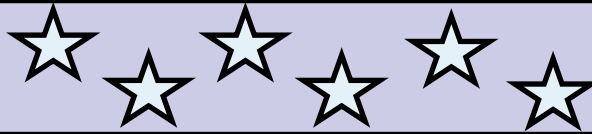

Charles Duane “Chuck” Warner was born in Norfolk, Nebraska on February 27, 1943. He passed away on Thursday, August 4, 2022 at Fairview Manor in Fairmont, Nebraska at the age of 79 years, 5 months, and 8 days.

Chuck was raised around the Mead, Nebraska area. He graduated from Mead High School in May 1962. He joined the US Air Force on January 4, 1963 and was stationed at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas. His rank was A-3C. He wanted to make a career of the Air Force, but was injured and discharged on April 10, 1963.

Chuck attended Southeast Community College (SCC) in Milford, Nebraska. He received a diploma in May 1966 in drafting technology and an Associates of Applied Science

in Drafting Technology in May 1976. Chuck completed a certificate for professional truck driving training from SCC in March 1989 and a certificate of completion for Smith Defensive Driving Theory in May 1990. Chuck married Peggy Hopken of Bruning, Nebraska on March 24, 1973. They were blessed with one son, Todd.

They lived in Lincoln for over forty years before moving to Exeter, Nebraska in 2015. Chuck enjoyed sailboat racing, woodworking, hunting, camping, fishing, visiting with family and friends, but most of all spending time with his granddaughter, Katelin. He belonged to the American Legion, Heartland Run-

abouts and Rolling Turtles camping groups (Family Campers and RVers).

Chuck was preceded in death by his parents Myle Warner Sr. and Rose (Classen) Warner; and his brothers Myles Warner Jr. and Leo Warner.

He is survived by his wife, Peggy of Exeter, Nebraska; son Todd (Jenny) of Lincoln, Nebraska; granddaughter, Katelin of Lincoln, Nebraska; brothers-in-law: Jerry (Carol) Hopken of Deshler, Nebraska and Allen Hopken of Lincoln, Nebraska; sister-

in-law Shirley Robertson of Lincoln, Nebraska; as well as several nieces and nephews.

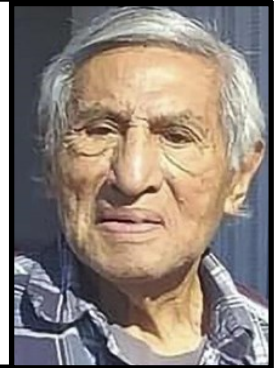

Gary graduated from Omaha Tech High School in 1961 and University of Nebraska Omaha (UNO) in 1967 with a degree in civil engineering. He started his professional career with Loziers in Omaha. Gary was employed with Wilson Concrete in Grand Island before his job as a Civil Engineer with the Nebraska Department of Roads where he stayed until he retired in 2015.

On October 13, 1973, Gary married his high school sweetheart, Linda Anderson, in Omaha. The couple made their home in Grand Island.

Gary and Linda were members of Peace Lutheran Church, the Liederkranz, Saddle Club and FCRV (Family Camping Recreational Vehicles). They were avid RV campers for 47 years. He also loved to garden and kept his lawn in tiptop shape. You could always see him out in the yard and garden getting all those pesky weeds. Gary always enjoyed watching his grandchildren in all their activities.

Those who cherish his memory include his wife of 49 years, Linda; children and their spouses, Karl Sander of Grand Island, Julie and Chad Ropte of Highlands Ranch, CO, and Lori and Jim Bertrand of Cottage Grove, MN; and six grandchildren, Courtney, Katie and Kasey Ropte, Jessica (Jake) Hansen and their son Carter, David Bertrand and Garret Bertrand.



Gary and Linda joined FCRV in February of 1995. They joined the Rovin' Pawnee Camping Chapter then later the Heartland Runabouts. Gary enjoyed being a member



of FCRV and made many friends over the years. Gary and Linda had several positions over the years. The most rewarding job was State Wildlife and Conservation Directors and learning from Donal and Donna Hansen. This position was a job of love for the outdoors and wildlife. Gary favorite job was working with the crew at Mahoney State Park and State Park Service organizing the planting of over 15,000 trees in a weekend. This work weekend later earned him the 2000 National Conservation Director award for state projects. Gary and Linda received National Conservation State Directors Award, Nebraska Director of Year and Nebraska Family of the Year awards.



Gary was involved in the work days at Stuhr Museum and Crane Meadows Nature Center. Gary and Linda were wildlife and conservation directors, Calling Editors, Nebraska Retiree directors and on the Scholarship Committee. At the time of Gary death, he was the treasury of the Scholarship Committee for the last 10 years.

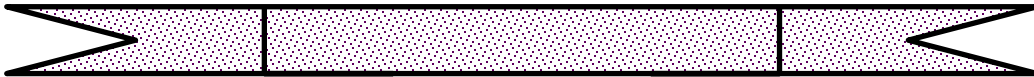
Meditation is a process used to focus one's thought on a particular idea such as the time spent when reading a section of the Bible or during communion.

We are pleased to inform everybody that we are adding 7 new C.A.M.P. activities. These additions are effective immediately.

- Cornhole – 50-cent certificate for each game
- Bocce Ball – 50-cent certificate for each game
- Horseshoe – 50-cent certificate for each game
- Kubb – 50-cent certificate for each game
- Washer Toss – 50-cent certificate for each game
- Ladder Golf – 50-cent certificate for each game

Family Campers and RVers members may earn Campers Actively Moving Program merchandise certificates for completing Campers Actively Moving Program activities. A Family Campers and RVers member can apply for only one Campers Actively Moving Program merchandise certificate for each activity completed and will be awarded according to the guidelines for each activity. Those guidelines are listed under Activity Guidelines.

Each Campers Actively Moving Program merchandise certificate can be redeemed for Family Campers and RVers merchandise from Family Campers and RVers or from a cooperating Family Campers and RVers merchandise vendor. The certificate can also be redeemed as part of the International Campvention fees. There is currently no limit on how many you may redeem at a time, and this includes other Program merchandise certificates as well.

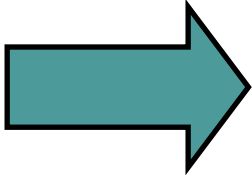

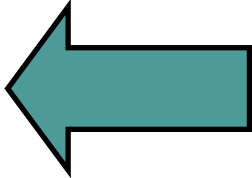
