Spring cleaning DASAT Thoughts Marilyn Rausch Safety Suggestions

We're getting closer to Spring, and that means camping weather... yeah!! It also means a less exciting rite called "Spring Cleaning." Not so much fun. This is a great time to look out for safety concerns in your home (and camper as well!) State Farm Insurance has prepared a spring cleaning checklist to make sure your home is as safe as it is clean. Here are a few of their suggestions.

- * CLEAN YOUR DRYER VENT. Even if you empty your lint trap after every load of laundry, lint can build up in the hose from the dryer and vent. This creates a fire hazard. During spring cleaning, use a vacuum hose, coat hanger, or plumbing snake to help clear out the lint that accumulates beyond the lint trap.
- * CHANGE YOUR AIR FILTERS. If you have a regular inspection service to check your furnace and air conditioner, they usually take care of this step. But if not, check and change the filters twice a year to trap dust, pollen, and pet danders.
- * UPDATE YOUR FIRST AID KIT AND OR-GANIZE YOUR MEDICINE CABINET. During the year, some items get depleted quickly and are replaced. Some are not used often, and may expire or go bad. At least once a year, go through your first aid supplies to replace any items that are missing or expired. Check all medicines for expiration dates and get rid of old or unused medication. The time NOT to do that is when you need them in an emergency!
- * LOCATE YOUR PERSONAL DOCUMENTS. During spring cleaning is a good time to locate and secure your social security card, birth certificate, will, deed, and other important documents. A good place to put them is into a fireproof safe, a safety deposit box, or upload them to a secure cloud service on the internet.
- * CHANGE YOUR ONLINE PASSWORDS. It may seem like a hassle, but changing your passwords regularly is an effective way to prevent accounts from being hacked or your identity from being stolen. A related task to add to this security "cleaning" is to clean out your email inbox so there is no accessible personal information that thieves can use against you.
- * REPLACE FRAYED EXTENSION CORDS. Extension cords get yanked and moved around to wherever we need them, Damage can occur on the cord, and those damaged cords are a big fire

risk. It is more economical to replace extension cords that are cracked or brittle than it is to replace a home or personal property!

- * CLEAN ELECTRICAL OUTLETS. Outlets are usually in areas that don't get much foot traffic (behind furniture, in corner areas.) That means they are in prime spots for dust and pet hair to build up. In the spring (and during the year as well) clean around the outlets with a dry cloth so that inadvertent sparks may not find a flammable bed to rest on! Also, feel the electrical outlet plates. They should never be warm, and if they are they need attention immediately!
- * CLEAN YOUR STOVE. Grease and food particles can build up over time, making your stove top and oven a fire hazard. Pull out the bottom drawer of your stove (if you have one) and clean inside and under the drawer. Clean carefully around the 220 outlet that provides electricity to your stove.
- * CHECK BATTERIES ON ALARMS. Check your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors and replace the batteries. Many people have been reminded to do this any time the clock is changed for daylight savings time. Take this time to wipe down the detectors and make sure dust build-up is not blocking the vents.
- * SPRING CLEAN YOUR HUMIDIFIERS. Humidifiers relieve dry skin and sinuses during the winter, but anything that holds water can produce mold, which could be dispersed into the air along with the humidity. Even if you use a bacteriostatic treatment in your humidifier, before storing it for the summer, rinse the water tank and fill it with white vinegar for half an hour to clean out anything growing inside.

And here are a few reminders for the more basic Spring Cleaning Ritual:

- Declutter before you clean to avoid tripping.
- Never mix two cleaning products together...the results could be deadly!
- Real all labels on cleaning products.
- Ventilate any area where cleaning products or paint are being used.
- Use step stools and ladders with caution...and don't substitute a chair or box, which could be unstable. Maintain three points of contact (two feet and one hand) to allow for balance.
- Ask for help when lifting or moving furniture to avoid injury.



APPLE CRUMB SLAB PIE

Great dessert for a Crowd! (Recipe from Pillsbury)

INGREDIENTS (FOR SLAB PIE)

- 2 9-inch pie crusts (or homemade pie crust)
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp ground nutmeg
- 9 cups apples, peeled and thinly sliced



INGREDIENTS FOR CRUMB TOPPING:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup quick-cooking oats
- 1/2 cup (one stick) cold butter, cubed.

PREPARATION

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees F.
- 2. On a lightly floured surface, stack pie crusts on top of each other and roll into a 12 x 17 inch rectangle.
- 3. Place crust into a 10 x 15 inch jelly roll pan, pressing into the corners. Fold any overhanging crust so it is even with the edges of the pan.
- 4. In a large bowl, mix together the brown sugar, flour, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Add apples and toss to coat. Spoon apples into the pan, spreading evenly across the rust.
- 5. In a medium bow., mix together the crumb topping. Stir together the flour, sugar, and oats, and add butter, cutting in with a pastry blender or two knives until crumbly. Sprinkle the topping over the apples.
- 6. Bake until crust and streusel are golden brown, 35-38 minutes. Let cool on wire rack for 30 minutes before serving. Enjoy!



Do you need a recipe for St. Patrick's Day? Here is a classic Irish side dish that will fit that need!

COLCANNON POTATOES

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 medium cabbage head, shredded (about 2 lbs.)
- 4 lbs. medium potatoes (about 8), peeled and quartered.
- 2 cups milk
- 1 cup chopped green onions
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt

- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1/4 c. melted butter
- Minced fresh parsley
- Crumbled cooked bacon.

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Place cabbage and 2 c. water in a large saucepan; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, until cabbage is tender, about 10 minutes. Drain, reserving cooking liquid; keep cabbage warm in separate dish.
- 2. In same pan, combine potatoes and reserved cooking liquid. Add additional water to cover potatoes; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cook, uncovered, until potatoes are tender, 15-20 minutes.
- 3. Place milk, green onions, salt and pepper in a small saucepan; bring just to a boil and remove from heat.
- 4. Drain potatoes; place in a large bowl and mash. Add milk mixture; beat just until blended.
- 5. Stir in cabbage.
- 6. To serve, drizzle with butter; top with parsley and bacon.

Hello, Campers! I am Kathy Howell, and I recently joined FCRV with the new Family & Friends Camping Club (FFCC) Chapter.

I am so happy to share with you a teen activity that has been a longstanding tradition in the FFCC group. It is called TP (toilet paper) Insurance and Raffle.

A little history of the program: Our group needed a fundraiser to increase the budget for our teen activities. The plan was simple – teens would sell TP raffle tickets, meet and socialize with other members of the club while doing so, and learn how to count and be responsible for money.

Members purchase a "card" of tickets, with 26 tickets per card to put toward raffle prizes. Since rallies always involve a bit of fun and shenanigans, the tickets serve as insurance to *not* have your rig toilet-papered by the teens. Simply display a card in your rig's window, and you're safe, at least from the *teens*. If TP'd by adults (that, of course, would never happen), the teens will clean up the mess.

Teens sell the tickets Monday morning until Wednesday evening. Thursday is the raffle. Where do the raffle prizes come from? Well, parents of the participating teens are asked to bring a raffle gift per teen to place in the raffle. Club chapters and individual families may also donate prizes. A small portion of the ticket sales proceeds is also designated for prizes.

There is pre-raffle viewing time to make your selections and place tickets in the containers next to the prizes of your choice. You decide how many of your tickets to put in as many raffle items you want. Teens help set-up the raffle and as winning numbers are selected, they deliver the prizes to the respective winners. Cash prizes are available, too.

The teens also win cash prizes for selling the most tickets. The money raised is then used to finance future teen activities, and as noted above, a small portion designated for the next year's prize purchases.

For the 2023 Campvention, my daughter, Jessica Hicks, and son, Zachary Chearhart, and I will be handling the TP ticket sales and raffle. We are asking that families of teens, please, bring a raffle prize per participating teen. Items donated in the past included camping chairs, games, gas/gift cards. Items may be camping or non-camping related, with a value of \$25-\$50. Specific donation drop-off instructions will be provided prior to Campvention.

On Our Way Northeast to New York That's right...2024 heads to New York, so we're celebrating the Northeast region on the last night.


