As our friends who attended the Retiree Campout in Dotham, Alabama, can attest, just because it is camping season doesn't mean the weather will cooperate. Weathering a storm in an RV or trailer can be a very frightening experience. It is wise to practice the "three B's": Be Aware, Be Prepared, and Be safe!!

Before you start your travels, do a little research on the expected climate for the time you plan to be there. It is as easy as googling the location with the filter "climate" or "weather."

BE AWARE

Someone in the camping group needs to make a habit of keeping track of the weather. You want to have as much warning as possible for storms. Smart phones have the advantage of tracking your location and keeping you aware of the changing weather.

If a storm is identified, keep track of it along with

any national or local weather alerts.

Know the dangers for your camping location. Is it in a flood plane? Are there tall trees that could fall on your RV? Is there debris or loose object that could become dangerous in a high wind?

Take note of areas where you can shelter in event of a serious storm. Where is the nearest official storm shelter? Where is a strudy public building in the immediate vicinity (Stone buildings and building with few or no windows are ides.) Often the bathrooms in a park are the safest place to head in a serious storm, since they are accessible, sturdy, and have few windows. Is there a storm shelter near by? Program it's location into your GPS for quick reference.

BE PREPARED

1. Have a portable survival pack. A backpack can be readied that contains first aid supplies, non-perishable food, clean water, essential medications and a light source. Keep it in a convenient place to grab if the need arises.

2. Charge up all your electronic devices. Make sure that your battery powered devices have fresh batteries. If you have multiple devices, use only one

at a time to get the most life out of them.

3. Prepare the RV. If you are in a dangerous area, consider moving the RV to more favorable position. If in a flood plane, try to fine higher ground. Get to a safer location before the storm

hits, but do not get on the road unless you know you can outrun the weather. Driving an RV or pulling a trailer in strong winds is a bad idea.

4. Gather up any loose items and put them away.

5. Turn off the propane.

6. Close blinds and vents and retract awnings.

- 7. Disconnecting Shore power during an electrical storm may help protect the RV systems (though it won't pose a danger to you.)
- 8. If a storm is imminent, dress for rough weather. Wear your sturdiest shoes and have a coat handy.
- 9. If you have smaller pets, secure them in carriers; keep a leash handy for larger animals. (Remember that your pets need a survival kit as well.)
- 10. Prepare a plan with those with whom you are camping. What do you plan to do and under which conditions do you plan to do it.
- 11. Contact someone outside of the potential storm area and let them know where you are and that you could be in some danger. Set a schedule for checking in with them.

BE SAFE

- 1. Stay Calm. Identify your greatest risk. Consider what you can do to reduce the risk without putting yourself in greater harm.
- 2. Seek Shelter. If possible, go to an actual storm shelter. If your RV is your only shelter, it is better than nothing. Stay away from windows and in a part of your RV that has the most structure.
- 3. Stay informed. Monitor the weather and don't let your guard down until authorities say the danger is passed.
 - a. Assess your health and the health of those you are with.

b. Check out your RV for damages.

- c. Identify any lingering hazards and work a plan to remove them as best you can in the safest way possible.
- d. Keep others informed that you are safe.

Life on the road has risks, but don't let them get in the way of living life to the fullest. Don't be afraid... be ready! The more you learn, the better your chances of staying safe in our wonderous, but sometimes dangerous, world.

Recipes worth Sharing!

Do you have an overabundance of hard-boiled eggs after the Easter-egg hunt is over? Here's a tasty way to use them up!

EGG SALAD FOR SANDWICHES

INGREDIENTS;

8 hard-boiled eggs
1/2 Cup mayonnaise
1/4 cup chopped green onion.
1 tsp. prepared yellow mustard.
1/4 tsp paprika
Salt and pepper to taste.



DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Peel and chop the eggs.
- 2. Place chopped eggs in bowl, stir in the rest of the ingredients.
- 3. Serve on rye bread, your favorite bread, or crackers.

Here is a light and refreshing dessert for Easter or any time!

EASY KEY LIME PIE

INGREDIENTS:

8 ox. Cream cheese, softened 14 oz sweetened condensed milk 1/2 cup Key lime juice or lime juice 1 9-inch graham cracker crusts 2 cups whipped topping Lime slices (optional



DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Beat Cream cheese until smooth.
- 2. Beat in milk and lime juice until blended.
- 3. Transfer to crust.
- 4. Refrigerate for at least 4 hours.
- 5. Just before serving, garnish with whipped topping and lime slices.

Note: for a festive green color, add 1-2 drops of green food coloring to step 2.

Hey, it's camping season! Here is an easy way to have S'Mores without a campfire!

ICE CUBE TRAY S'MORES POCKETS



INGREDIENTS:

- 1 14.1 ox package of refrigerated pie dough. (or homemade)
- 1 10-oz bag of marshmallows.
- 1 (1.5 oz) bar of milk, semi-sweet or dark chocolate. 1/2 stick (1/4 cup unsalted butter, melted.

Raw or turbinade sugar (optional) for dusting. Ice cube tray

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Place 1 sheet of pie dough gently over ice cube
- 3. Working carefully, gently use you knuckles to loosely press the pie dough into the ice cube molds.

- 4. Place one marshmallow in each mold, then top with one square of chocolate.
- 5. Lay remaining pie crust on top of the ice cube tray and use a rolling pin to seal all the edges together.
- 6. Once edges are sealed, use a paring knife to trim away excess dough.
- 7. Flip ice cube tray and gently remove the s'mores. Cut in between the 'pies" and transfer to the lined baking sheet.
- 8. Brush each with melted butter and sprinkle sugar on top.
- 9. Place in the oven and bake for 20-22 minutes until golden.
- 10. Remove from oven. Let cool at least 5 minutes before serving.
