Are you ready for some camping? In just a few short weeks we will be getting the motorhome out of storage and after a couple of days at Lake 370 we will be leaving for

Dothan AL - the Peanut Capital of the World. Just typing this is getting me excited to begin this year's camping adventures.

I would like to point out a few changes to the 2023 schedule. In the last issue I reported that the Regional Campout was "tentatively" scheduled for Jun 27 - 30 at ABC Campground in Branson. That has changed. It will be held June 18 - 21, 2023 at Treasure Lake RV Resort in Branson MO. Check the Missouri Facebook Group for more details or send me an email and I'll send information.

In addition to the change to the regional campout, some other campouts have been added. Pitch 'n' Pull added three campouts and Area 1 Western Council added the April Fools Campout and the Halloween Campout. By my count there are 23 listings for campouts but since two of them are for early days let's drop that down to 21. And that is just in Missouri. If you are traveling and would like to camp with a chapter give the national office a call and ask if there are any state or chapter campouts in the in which you will be staying. The chapter campouts are no longer available on the fcrv.org website but national will be happy to give you the information.

One small item to mention is the pop tab and plastic cap collection at Campvention in Richmond IN. The following was published on the Campvention Facebook group a few weeks ago. This is a change from last year.

Pop tabs will be collected at Campvention 2023; they will be donated to Ronald McDonald House at the Riley Children's hospital in Indianapolis. If you choose not to haul all your tabs to Richmond, you may take them to a recycling center between now and the Campvention and get them weighed, obtain a receipt for pounds and the dollar amount. Then take the donated amount to your local Ronald McDonald House or similar charity. Don't forget to make a copy of the receipt and bring to Campvention to turn in to myself. Also, we collect plastic caps for benches. Indiana FCRV members have purchased a few benches in the past in memorial of a FCRV member and placed the benches in those members' home towns or favorite campgrounds, or wherever that member wants to donate to. The list of caps include: water bottle caps, Gatorade caps, milk jug caps, butter bowl lids, cottage cheese lids and peanut butter lids to name a few. We will have containers for collection of these all week. Just put that plastic cap in your pocket until you pass one of our containers! You can also start saving now and bring with you. Go to <u>www.greentreeplastics.com</u> to find a complete list.

In the last issue I had asked all chapter presidents to send a list of their paid chapter members. To date only one chapter has sent that information. I need the information to verify that your paid chapter members are also paid FCRV members. Please send the list ASAP.
