

EASY CHEESY HAM AND EGG BAKE

INGREDIENTS:

1 pound deli ham slivered or chopped 2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese 8 eggs

1/4 cup milk or cream Salt and pepper to taste

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Grease an 8-inch square baking dish. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.
- Beat the eggs and milk or cream together.
 Stir in the ham and cheddar cheese.
- 4. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 5. Place in oven and bake for 25-30 minutes, until knife pushed into center comes out clean.
- 6. Let set for 5-10 minutes before serving.

HUMMINGBIRD CAKE

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups vegetable oil

FOR FROSTING

2 1/2 tsp vanilla extract, divided

1 (8 oz0 can crushed pineapple with juice

1 cup unsalted butter, softened

2 cups powdered sugar, sifted

2 (8 oz) packages cream cheese, softened


3-4 medium bananas, chopped

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 cups pecans, roasted and chopped
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups sugar
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/8 tsp ground nutmeg
- 3 large eggs, lightly beaten

PREPARATION

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Coat 3 9-inch round cake pans with cooking spray. Line bottom of each pan with parchment paper.
- 2. Whisk flour, sugar, cinnamon, salt, baking soda and nutmeg in large mixing bowl.
- Add eggs, oil, 1 1/2 tsp vanilla, stirring until just moistened.
 Gently fold in bananas, pineapple, and 1 cup toasted pecans until batter has thickened. Pour batter evenly into prepared cake pans.
- 5. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until toothpick inserted not center comes out clean.
- 6. Cool in pans for 10 minutes. Remove cakes from pan and cool completely. Remove parchment paper.
- 7. Prepare ream cheese frosting.
 - a. Beat cream cheese, softened butter, 1 tsp vanilla extract until smooth.
 - b. Slowly add powdered sugar, mixing on low speed until blended.
 - c. Beat on medium for 3 minutes or until fluffy.
- 8. Place cooled cake on a cake stand or serving plate. Top with 1/4 cream cheese frosting. Top with second layer and top with 1/4 cream cheese frosting. Top with third layer and spread remaining frosting over top and sides of cake. Garnish with reserved pecans.




