

Below are some commonly used words or phrases.
Please utilize this Glossary as needed.

Glossary of Terms

Adult & Family Center - A fun space for all attendees to enjoy activities. Often a gathering place to play board games, do puzzles and chat with other attendees.

Adult Games - Yard Games for friendly competition between adult members.

Advisory Committee - A group of appointed volunteers that advise the Trustees on specific portions of FCRV.

Aluminum Tabs- The tab at the top of a pop (soda) can that can be twisted off and turned in for Ronald McDonald House Charities.

Announcements - A time before evening entertainment to announce updates, changes, and general information.

Any Hat (or Red Hat/Hard Hat) Luncheon - A catered meal open to anyone who has pre-registered.

Band - FCRV has a group that comes together to put on a concert at Campvention each year. Anyone who plays an instrument is welcome to join. See the schedule for practice and performance times.

Bulletin Boards - Places throughout Campvention where you can see announcements about changes in activities. Check them frequently, especially if you miss the Announcements at the Evening Program.

CAMP: <u>Campers Actively Moving Program also Camp</u> Walk - This program promotes FCRV members being active. Since we originated as a camping and hiking association, the primary activity is walking or hiking and is often organized and listed in the program each morning as a "Camp Walk."

Campvention - Official term for the annual convention/rally for FCRV that moves between regions each year.

Campvention Office - Centralized location for clerical activities during Campvention. Staffed through the day by Campvention Committee members. Helpful resource and a good place to start if you need help. Usually near the Information Center.

Continued...

Central Registration (or Registration) - Once parked, central registration follows up with actual registration to the campout. This is done to alleviate slowdowns and lines at the gate when coming in. You can register for most "preregistered" activities here. Bring money or checkbook to cover luncheons, crafts, etc... Also, a good place to offer to volunteer on activities that need help throughout the week.

Chapters - What individual clubs within FCRV are called. Can be activity or location related. Members can belong to multiple Chapters, if they choose to or none at all. Nonchapter affiliated members are called Members-At-Large.

Closing Ceremonies - The ending event on Friday Evening to thank everyone for coming and introduce attendees to next year's Campvention. Usually followed by a "welcome" hospitality from the region/state/province hosting next year's Campvention (though not this year, since next year's Campvention is hosting Hospitality at the Family Dance on Thursday).

Commercial Area - Space provided for businesses that have contracted with FCRV to promote or sell their products at our Campvention. A little like a mall, you can shop from business to business throughout the week. Be sure to stop in early, in case you want to special order something that will take time to complete. Most vendors with special orders can complete the order by the end of Campvention if you shop at the beginning of the week.

Conservation - One of the programs of FCRV. The organization has a strong history and focus on improving the environment. Several contests and activities focus on bringing awareness to conservation at Campvention.

Crafts - Unless specified for another age group, these are creative activities targeted at an adult skill level.

DASAT - Disaster And Safety Awareness Training - A program within FCRV focused on improving members' knowledge, prevention, and preparedness for a variety of disasters, both personal and wide scale. See the seminars for several devoted to this program, such as "The Active Shooter" and "Drug Safety".

Entertainment - Usually held at the Evening Program. Generally, paid local acts that come in for us to enjoy each day at Campvention.

Evening Program - Activity that takes place in the evenings after supper. Usually some form of entertainment, but can be meetings, raffles, games, etc...

Family Funday - An afternoon of fun and games put on by the Trustees. The teens generally sell lunch as a fundraiser. No other activities are scheduled so all of us can come together and enjoy! Excellent time to meet new people!

FCRV - Family Campers & RVers - An organization established in 1949 as NCHA to promote fun, friendship, fellowship, and family feelings for all campers/RVers of all ages and styles of camping. It's where strangers become friends and friends become family.

FFCC - Family & Friends Camping Club - An organization merged with FCRV as their own chartered national chapter.

Food Pantry/Food Bank - Depending on the Campvention, we often do a food drive to drop off non-perishable items to a local food pantry.

General Membership Meeting - Yearly meeting for all members to attend.

Continued...

Goodie Bags - Bags filled with local information, free items and campout information that you receive at Central Registration.

Hospitality - An event hosted by a State, Region or Group to welcome attendees with snacks and beverages on behalf of that group. Note: The line for a Hospitality is a traditional part of the event in which you meet new friends and greet the hosting group before being rewarded with snacks and beverages. If you're new, try to embrace the wait as part of the festivities

Locator Board - Indicates where each camper is parked. A tool to help find attendees in emergencies or if you need to find someone on grounds for any reason. Also useful for finding targets for TPing.

Marketplace - An event that allows Chapters and Members to sell their wares to the other members.

Name Tags - Can be purchased at Commercial from an authorized vendor. Many different styles to choose from. Should be worn through Campvention to help your fellow campers remember all the names they are learning and getting to know and if worn offsite to local businesses can be used to help promote FCRV and show businesses that sponsored portions of the event that we're supporting them back.

NCHA - National Campers & Hikers Association - The original name was changed to NCHA doing business as FCRV in 1992



Noise Parade - Unscheduled event that happens generally during sleeping hours. A long-standing tradition of goodnatured fun that can happen as a celebration for any event or for no reason at all. Any group can have a noise parade. Local laws should be considered when planning one. If you hear one coming, making noise is strongly encouraged.

Opening Ceremonies - The welcoming event on Sunday Evening to prepare everyone for the coming week. Usually followed by a "welcome" hospitality from the home region/ state/province.

Parade - A cumulative event where groups/states/provinces/ regions can enter floats to walk/drive in. Historically, the parades went through the town we were camping in, but in recent times have stayed on the campgrounds. (Different than a Noise Parade...)

Region - A set group of states or provinces that work together. Often, they host a combined campout rotating around the region and work together when Campvention comes to their region.

State or Provincial Association - A breakdown of FCRV that all members that live within that State or Province belong to. Different from Chapters, as all members are included in a State or Provincial Association.

Trade Items - While standing in line (usually at Hospitality) you may ask your surrounding fellow FCRVers if they have these items. Generally small and easy to keep in pockets, you trade your item for theirs. Having a safety pin or key chain on the trade items would help to hook it to vests, sashes and clothing to allow people to see the many trade items that you had acquired from other members.

Continued...

Tram - Public transportation within the Campvention. Usually a golf cart but can be any motorized vehicle used for moving participants from different areas of the grounds. Volunteers always needed.

Trustees - The governing group of elected officials of FCRV.

Seminars - Educational opportunities on varied subjects offered at a campout.

Teen - Any attendee between the ages of 13-19. Teen activities are geared specifically for teens and attendees from other age groups are not permitted to attend teen activities unless invited by the Teen Staff.

Teen Center - Area designated for teen activities. A general hangout or meeting location to gather all the kids that are 13-19 years of age.

Vendors - Businesses that have contracted with FCRV to promote or sell their products at our Campvention.

Vendor Bucks - A gift certificate from Campvention to encourage shopping in the Commercial section of Campvention. (Not for use at Marketplace)

Youth - Any attendee between the ages of 0-12.

Youth Center - Area designated for youth activities. Where fun games, crafts, and playing can be found for the children ages 0-12.




Rules



Youth registration will take place Friday, Saturday, and Sunday during Central Registration. Youth will receive their wristband when registration takes place. The wristband is to be worn at all times.

Children younger than 5 need to be accompanied by a responsible adult during all activities, crafts, and games

All Parents must remain on grounds while youth attend youth activities.

Parents can sign-up for volunteering with the Youth Program at Registration.

All activities will start at the Youth Center unless otherwise posted. Please have your children meet there for the event.

Please be sure to have children arrive on time for events and pick them up from the Youth Center at the specific end times if you are not staying with the child for the event.

Schedule is subject to change - changes will be posted on the bulletin boards and announced at the evening activities.

TEEN INFORMATION

All teens need to carry an 2023 FCRV Teen Card with them at all times.

Curfew is at 1 am

All teens will need to be on their campsite by 1am every night unless escorted by an adult. Any teen found off of their campsite without an escort will be taken to the Campvention Security Office where their responsible adult will be notified to come pick up their teen. Repeated violations are subject to discipline by the National Teen Director and the Board of Trustees.

Any violations of FCRV rules or Campvention rules will be referred to the National Teen Director.

Amy DeCamp was the chairperson from FFCC for the merger with FCRV. Amy led the movement to merge the Family and Friends Camping Club (formerly Starcraft Camper Club) into FCRV as a chapter. During the process she was instrumental in convincing both clubs of the advantages the merger held. As a result of her leadership, approximately 80 families joined FCRV. FFCC was formerly a manufacturer's club made up of owners of Starcraft equipment. As mergers, sell-outs, bankruptcies, etc. took place the club membership went from single manufactured equipment owners to multi-brand owners. When sponsorship withdrew, FFCC was no longer in a position to financially continue to hold annual National Rallies. 

- 2. If the golf cart does not have lights, proper lights must be provided to drive at night.
- 3. Use hand signals when turning or stopping
- 4. Pedestrians always have the right of way.
- 5. Golf carts may not leave the Campvention grounds.
- Passengers on a golf cart may not exceed the number of people it has seats for. Only children under the age of 6 will be allowed to sit on a lap.
- 7. Remove keys when not in use.
- 8. The owner of a golf cart brought to Campvention is responsible for any damage to the golf cart, damage to any property, and for any personal injury to the driver and any other person(s).
- 9. The renter of a golf cart rented for Campvention is responsible for any damage to the golf cart, damage to any property, and for any personal injury to the driver and any other person(s).
- 10. For your protection, check with your insurance company to determine if you and/or another driver and passengers are covered by your insurance company.
