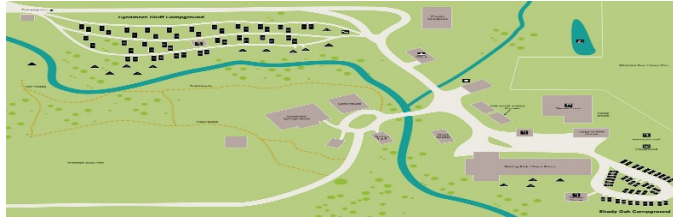

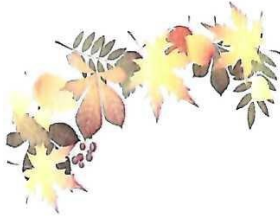

Meeting adjourned at 3:30 pm following a motion from Pam Failor, second from Harold Johnson.

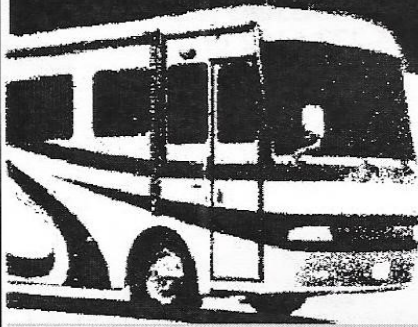

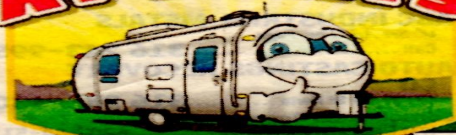

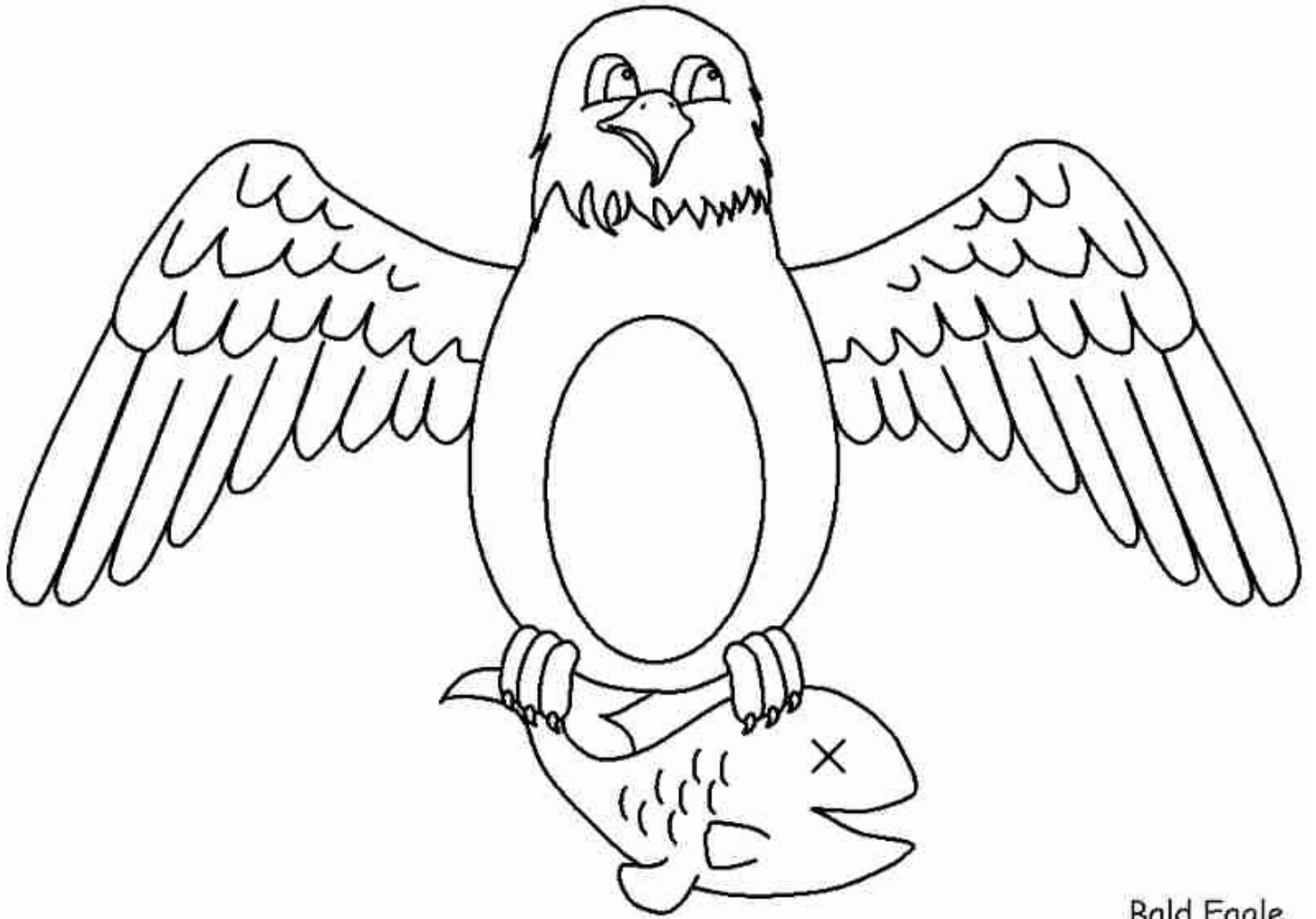
