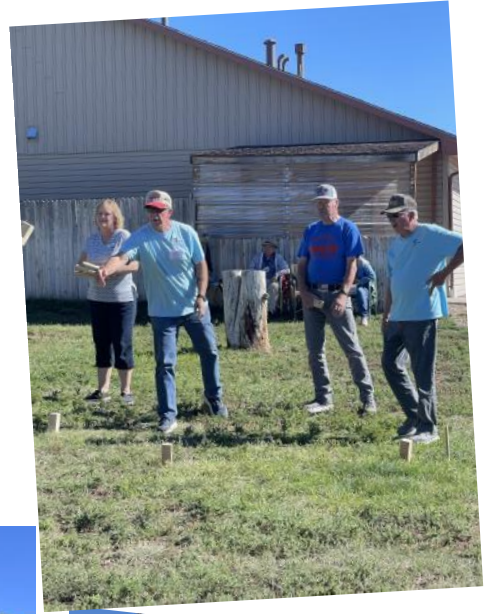

Woodland Wookies

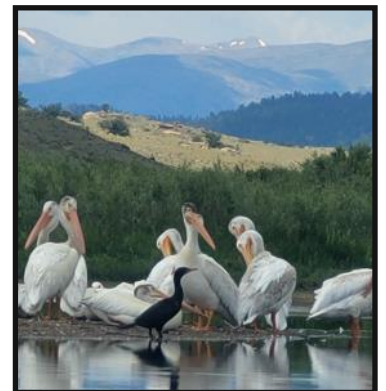

Quick 'n Easy Pumpkin Bread Recipe

Description: Looking for a quick bread? Looking for a pumpkin bread that's easy to make? This recipe is both!

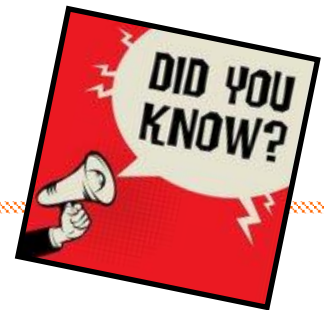
Pumpkin Bread Ingredients:

2 cups buttermilk pancake mix	1 cup cooked pumpkin
¾ cups brown sugar, firmly packed	1/3 cup vegetable oil
½ tsp. nutmeg	2 eggs, beaten
½ tsp. ground cloves	1 tsp. cinnamon
¼ tsp. Ginger	¼ cup milk
½ cups chopped walnuts	

How to make Quick 'n Easy Pumpkin Bread:

Preheat oven to 350 ° F. Grease a 9" X 5" X 3" loaf pan. In a large mixing bowl, combine together all ingredients, except the walnuts.

Use an electric mixer and beat for three minutes until batter is smooth. Stir in walnuts. Pour batter into loaf pan. Bake in oven for 45 to 55 minutes. Use a toothpick to test for doneness. Allow to cool in pan for 10 to 15 minutes. Remove from pan and finish cooling on a cooling rack.

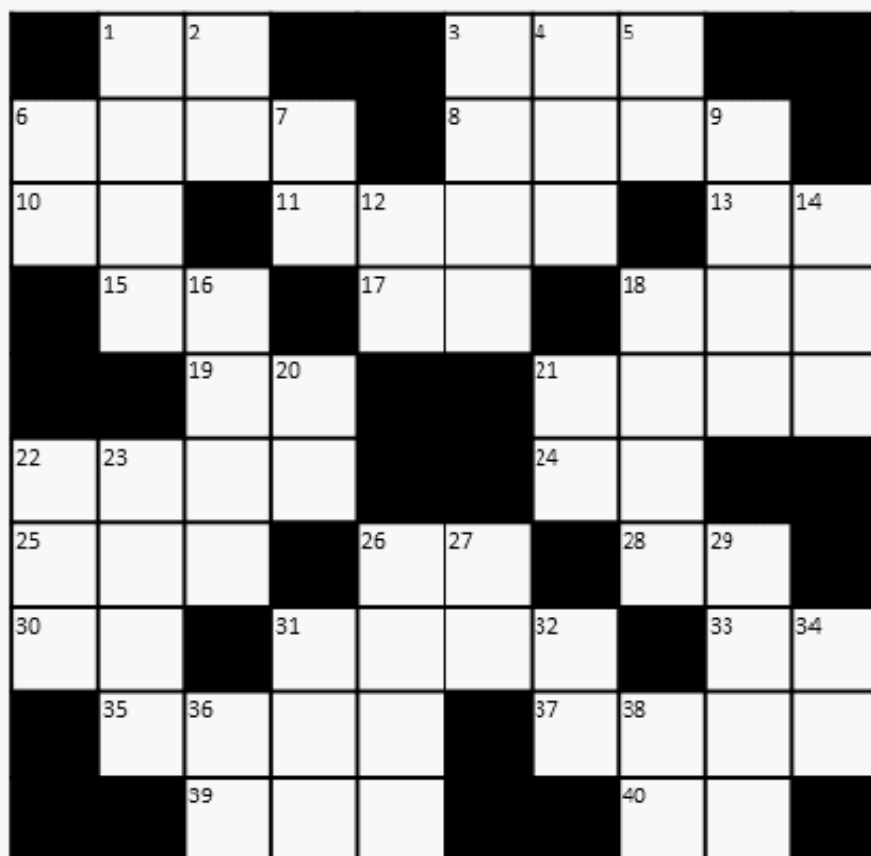
CHAPTER NEWS
