Hey Campers! It's that time of year again. No, I don't mean tax time – well, yeah, that, too, but time to think about going camping and what to fix for those fabulous potlucks we all so enjoy. This year, we need to be a little more aware of other campers with food sensitivities. Some of our members are allergic to specific foods or have dietary restrictions. It would be nice if when a dish is prepared, you might note somehow (post-it on the item, include the recipe, etc.) if it has cinnamon, lots of sugar, chocolate, shellfish, or nuts. Please keep in mind some of our campers are diabetic or require a gluten-free option. If you would like to make a gluten-free dish, please avoid cross-contamination of pots, pans, cooking utensils, countertops, and ovens/ fryers of all kinds. We also should set those glutenfree dishes on a completely separate table to keep them safe for our campers.

Wondering what to prepare? Taste of Home.com offers a wide variety of ideas. Summertime favs like Five-Bean Salad, Broccoli Salad Supreme (LOVE those grapes), Beans & Sausage, Slow-Cooked Ham & Pineapple. Something easy like chicken simply baked & seasoned with salad dressing and onion soup mix. Fresh fruit. Or how about a charcuterie board with fruits, gluten-free salami, shrimp, ham, and turkey, a few crackers (always check the label) and some York peppermint patties? Come on, Campers. You're a creative bunch. Just a little time and effort to make our fellow campers comfortable, welcome and well fed!

Gluten Free – Flourless Peanut Butter-Chocolate Chip Cookies Ingredients Preparation 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Stir together peanut butter and next 4 ingredients in a medium bowl until well 1 cup creamy peanut butter 3/4 cup sugar blended. Stir in chocolate morsels. 1 large egg 1/2 teaspoon baking soda 2. Drop dough by rounded tablespoonfuls 2 inches 1/4 teaspoon salt apart onto parchment paper-lined baking sheets 1 cup semisweet chocolate morsels 3. Bake at 350° for 12 to 14 minutes or until puffed Parchment paper and lightly browned. Cool on baking sheets on a wire rack 5 minutes. Transfer to wire rack, and let cool 15 minutes.

Spring is here. Don't believe me? Earlier this week, February 26, the temperature was 82 degrees here in Saint Peters. Of course, the next day it dropped into the 40s but it looks like Spring is coming early. And that is good news

to campers everywhere. So start getting your rigs ready for your first trip.

For Beth and I that will be a trip to Mineola TX for the Retiree Rally. But don't let the name fool you. You don't have to be retired to attend. Of course, if you are still working you will need enough vacation time but it is well worth the time.

Another great trip adventure occurs in June with a trip to Herkimer County Fairgrounds in New York for the Campvention celebrating the 75 anniversary of FCRV.

Of course, back then it was NCHA. Check out the history of NCHA/FCRV on the website. <u>https://fcrv.</u> <u>org/history/</u> Beth and I were members of NCHA back in the mid-seventies and attended a couple of Campventions - 1997 in Duquoin IL with 1,780 families attending and again in 1978 in Elbert CO with 5,280 families attending. The highest attendance was in 1972 at Camp Atterbury IN with 7,842 families attending.

Unfortunately, membership and attendance has dropped over the years. This is not just an FCRV problem but for camping clubs in general. There are a lot of theories about why this is happening in an age where there are more RVs on the road than ever before and sales reaching an all time high in the past few years. I won't get into my theories here but I will tell you what we need to do.

We need to share the story about FCRV to everyone you see in a campground. We need to exemplify the motto of FCRV. Where Strangers Become Friends and Friends Become Family. Perhaps it sounds a bit trite. But in our 10 years since we have rejoined FCRV, we have seen this to be the case time and time again. If you want some examples, just ask me and I can give you five or six just in the last couple of years. So, why am I telling you all this. Because FCRV needs your help. It is a great organization but we need to do something to boost the membership and RETAIN the membership. I've already talked about telling everyone you see to help boost the membership but what's this about retaining the membership.

Yep, we need to keep the members we have. Most of the people that leave FCRV do so because they are not getting the full benefit of their membership. They camp strictly at the chapter level. Now, don't get me wrong. Camping at the chapter level is great. For the last 10 years we have camped with all four chapter in Missouri. For the first 5 years we camped strictly with Gateway Campers and didn't miss a campout. Of course, then came retirement and we started to camp with the Slow Travelers also. And we started to attend the national Retiree Rally and Campvention. Also during that time we went to ALL of the MSCA State Campventions. WHY?? Because they are fun and we meet more new people who are now part of our camping family.

So, people who are active in the organization are the ones that stay with the organization. And not just active from a camping perspective. We need you to be active in the leadership of the organization. We have positions that need to be filled. Three right now that are vacant that we would like to have filled are the DASAT (Disaster and Safety Awareness Training) position, The Conservation position and the Wildlife position. If any of these seem like something you can do please contact me. Also, consider running for one of the MSCA positions (see page 2 of this newsletter for a list) And don't assume that just because it is currently filled doesn't mean you can't run for the office.
