


Hello Camp Family,

DASAT Thoughts Marilyn Rausch

#### WE LIVE IN A UNIQUE PLACE AND TIME WHEN UNPRECIDENTED RISKS ACCOMPANY TRAVEL, ESPECIALLY WHEN GOING OUT OF THE COUNTRY.

Summertime is travel time! And not all travel is in a camper. Whatever way you take your vacation, protecting yourself, your identity and your property should be in your plans! Extra security measures may be indicated if you are leaving the United States for that dream vacation (or work trip).

Part of vacation fun includes sharing your adventures with your family and friends. The wise traveler would limit those communications until <u>after</u> their return home. Nothing says "welcome" to a thief more clearly than knowing that you are going to be away for a specified amount of time.

That said, let someone you trust know your trip itinerary. Check in with that person regularly during your trip, particularly if plans change in any way.

It would be wise not to depend only on your phone's live GPS service if going to an unfamiliar area. Download an offline version of Google Maps on your phone to use if, for any reason, you lose cell service.

If traveling abroad, The State Department provides a program called STEP. If you register with STEP, you will receive safety updates when in a foreign country. It will also give your information to the US Embassy or Consulate there in case of emergency.

Check with your cell phone service before leaving the country for what is needed to use your phone data out of the country. You may need to get a local sim card or a temporary international plan rider so that you can use it to book an Uber, look at a map for local services, etc.

Crossroads Magazine (publication of AAA Hoosier Motor Club) has some good suggestions for protecting your personal and financial data in their May/ June 2024 issue.

#### BEFORE YOUR TRIP

- \* Determine what you need for your trip (driver's license, passport, essential credit/debit cards.) Leave everything else at home in a secure place.
- \* Notify your financial institution if you will be traveling out of the country so they will not automatically decline your credit card.
- \* Put a hold on your mail or have someone pick up your mail while you are gone so it doesn't accumulate at the mailbox.
- \* Prepay bills that will become due while you are gone to prevent exposing your financial information over public Wi-Fi.

#### WHILE TRAVELING

- \* If using public Wi-Fi, avoid sharing personal information which could more easily be intercepted.
- \* Use mobile travel tickets when possible. Paper boarding passes contain a lot of personal information. When no longer needed, shred or tear into pieces rather than just discarding.
- \* Keep all paper documents secure, but photograph passports, credit card information, and driver's license in case they are lost or stolen.
- \* If possible, avoid remote ATMs. Scammers and/ or cameras may be used to acquire your personal information.
- \* Do not let vendors take your credit card out of your sight when running a payment.

#### AFTER RETURNING HOME

- \* Change passwords on personal accounts that you might have used while on vacation. (those passwords should be changed periodically anyway!)
- \* Check your bank and credit card accounts for unexpected changes.
- \* If you frequently travel, especially out of state or overseas, it may be worth subscribing to a credit monitoring organization that may pick up on suspicious activity in your accounts in real time.


#### PERSONAL SAFETY TIPS:

- \* Research the local area to identify local crime concerns, common scams, safety to walk in the areas you will find yourself.
- \* If you are going to an all-inclusive resort, do not leave the boundaries of that resort without checking on the safety in those surrounding areas.
- \* When walking in unfamiliar areas, carry a handheld sound alarm (one brand is *Birdie*). It can emit a loud sound in a potentially dangerous situation, and is legal everywhere (mace, pepper spray, etc. are illegal in some areas.)
- \* Move with purpose (even if you don't know where you are going.) Stay alert to the area around you. Try not to call attention to yourself as an "obvious tourist" or to walk with your eyes focused on your cell phone.

Have a wonderful summer and exciting travels. Just use a bit of caution so that the memories you make are good ones!!


# es worth Sharing LOADED POTATO BITES

#### **INGREDIANTS:**

- 20 Oz bag of shredded hash-browns, thawed.
- 1 egg
- 5 slices of bacon, fried and crumbled
- 1 1/4 c. Mexican blend cheddar cheese •
- 1/2 c. sour cream .
- 1/4 tsp salt •

#### DIRECTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 425 degrees 1.
- Pour hash browns into a large bowl. Stir in egg, 2. sour cream, salt, cheese, and bacon.
- Using a 2-tsp scoop, make balls and place on a 3. silicone mat or parchment paper.
- Bake for 25 minutes. Serve warm. 4.



## **STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKE**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 1/2 pounds strawberries, stemmed and sliced •
- 1/3 c. sugar •
- 3 c. all purpose flour
- 1/4 c. granulated sugar
- 2 Tbsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp salt
- 3/4 c. cold unsalted butter, cut into small pieces
- $1 \frac{1}{3}$  c. cold heavy cream
- 1 tbsp pure vanilla extract
- 2 tbsp heavy cream (for brushing)
- Turbinado sugar for sprinkling on shortcakes.
- Whipped Cream

#### DIRECTIONS:

- Mix strawberries and sugar. Set aside. 1.
- Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Line cookie sheets 2. with parchment paper.
- Sift together flour, sugar, and baking powder. 3.
- Using pastry blender or 2 knives, cut the butter 4. into the dry ingredients until you have pea-sized pieces.
- In a small bowl, stir together the heavy cream and 5. vanilla extract. Pour over the flour mixture and stir until just combined.
- Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and lightly 6. knead until the dough comes together. Do not overmix.
- Press the dough into a circle 1 inch thick. Cut 7. into rounds using a biscuit cutter. Place on prepared baking sheet, 2 inches apart. Refrigerate for 30 minutes.
- 8. Brush the chilled biscuit tops with heavy cream and sprinkle tops generously with turbinado sug-
- Bake until golden brown (15-20 minutes. 9.

#### **ASSEMBLY:**

Cut biscuits in half horizontally. Spoon strawberries over the bottom layer, add whipped cream, to bith the other biscuit half. Add more strawberries and whipped cream. (You can also break the biscuits into a bowl and top them with strawberries and whipped cream.
