Feed My Sheep Travel Light

One of the things we really like about camping is the travel and the different places and things we get to see. We seem to fill the camper when we go. Having watched others at different campsites as they prepare to go home or go further on, we are not alone in that action. I have yet to see a camper with empty space in the storage compartments or the interior cabinets. I'm as guilty as the

rest. "What if I need......" seems to be the phrase I hear most often. Travel light? Who are you kidding?

But when Jesus sent out his disciples, he gave them explicit instructions to "travel light". No bags, no sandals, not even an extra tunic. He even gave instructions on the other kind of "baggage" people

travel with their response to the message the disciples were bringing. If they were not welcome, they were to shake the dust of their feet and move on. Do not be weighed down with the "baggage" of resentment or defeat.

All of us encounter successes and failures on our journey. How we deal traveling those hills and valleys may be determined by whether we are carrying unnecessary weight or not, and I'm not talking about that spare tire around our middles. God is with us, leading us, guiding us, loving us, providing for us -- all with His unlimited resources. What do we need? Do we need strength, peace, love, joy, or hope? He has it all. Expert safety tips for RV & camping season

- Practice campfire safety According to the National Park Service, nearly 85% of wildland fires in the U.S. are caused by humans, and one of the most common human-causes is unattended campfires. If you plan on having a campfire, make sure to build your campfire in a pit or bare patch of dirt and keep it low and away from brush. Always tend to your fire and ensure it's completely extinguished before leaving your campsite or going to bed. Be prepared for an emergency by packing a compact, lightweight fire extinguishing device such as the First Alert EZ Fire Spray.
- Prepare for weather Always research the weather of where you're camping, RVing or hiking before getting there but keep in mind that weather is unpredictable and inclement weather can arrive quickly and unexpectedly. When you first arrive at a campground or park, it's a good idea to get oriented with your surroundings right away. Make sure you can locate nearby shelters in case you need to wait out a bad storm and keep a portable radio on hand to watch for weather updates.
- Get alarmed The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) estimates that nearly 2,000 RV fires occur annually. If you plan on spending any time in an RV or van this year, make sure you have a working smoke alarm installed and test it regularly.
