DASAT Thoughts Marilyn Rausch

Last month we presented AAA's recommendations on checking your tires. This month the focus is on making sure your vehicle is ready for winter. Again, this is taken from the AAA website.

Winter Car Care Checklist

BATTERY AND CHARGING SYSTEM

A fully charged battery in good condition is needed to start an engine in cold weather. Especially if the battery is more than three years old, have it checked by a trained technician.

BATTERY CABLES AND TERMINALS

Check the cable ends and the terminals to assure they are free from corrosion and that the connections are tight.

DRIVE BELTS

Inspect the underside of accessory drive belts for cracks or fraying. Many newer multi-rib "serpentine" belts are made of materials that do not show obvious signs of wear. These should be replaced at 60,000 mile intervals.

ENGINE HOSES

Inspect cooling system hoses for leaks, cracks or loose clamps. Squeeze the hoses and replace any that feel brittle or excessively spongy.

TIRE TYPE AND TREAD

In areas with heavy winter weather, snow tires provide the best winter tractions. All-season tires work well in light-to-moderate snow conditions provided they have adequate tire tread (more than 3/32 inches of tread.) If tire wear is uneven, address the problems of wheel balance or suspension problems.

TIRE PRESSURE

Check the tire inflation pressures frequently as the temperature drops (pressure drops about one PSI for every 10 degrees F), Proper tire pressures may be found on a sticker inside the driver's door jamb or in the manual).

AIR FILTER

Hold the engine air filter up to a 60-watt light bulb. If light can be seen through it, it is clean enough to work. If light is blocked, replace the filther.

COOLANT LEVELS

Check the coolant level in the overflow tank when the engine is cold. If it is low, add a 50/50 solution of coolant and water to maintain the necessary antifreeze capability. (An inexpensive tester to check the antifreeze protection level is available at auto parts stores.

LIGHTS

Check the operation of the headlight, taillights, brake lights, turn signals, emergency flashers and back-up lights. Replace any burnt-out bulbs.

WIPER BLADES

Blades should completely clear the glass with each swipe. Replace blades that leave streaks or missed spots. In areas of common snow, consider installing winter wiper blades that wrap the blade frame in a rubber boot to reduce ice and snow buildup.

WASHER FLUID

Fill the windshield washer fluid reservoir with a winter cleaning solution that has antifreeze components to prevent it from freezing.

BRAKES

If there is any suspicion of a brake problem, have the system inspected by a certified technician to ensure all components are in good working order.

FLUIDS

Check transmission, brake, and power steering fluids to ensure they are at or abobe the minimum safe levels.

EMERGENCY ROAD KIT

A winter weather emergency kit might include:

- Mobile phone pre-programmed with rescue apps, important phone numbers, car charger.
- Drinking water
- First-aid kit
- Non-perishable snacks (human and pet0
- Traction materials (sand, salt, cat litter or traction mats)
- Snow shovel
- Blankets
- Extra goves, hats, scarves
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Window washer solvent
- Ice scraper with brush
- Cloth or roll of paper towels
- Jumper cables
- Warning devices (flares, reflective triangles)
- Basic tool kit (screwdrivers, pliers, adjustable wrench.

A little care in advance may prevent a big headache (or worse) later

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 15-oz can Pumpkin Puree
- 1 12-oz can evaporated milk
- 3 large eggs
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup light brown sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- DIRECTIONS
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine pumpkin puree, evaporated milk, eggs, granulated sugar, brown sugar and spices. Mix until smooth.
- 3. Pour the pumpkin mixture into a greased 9 x 13 baking dish.
- 4. Sprinkle the dry yellow cake mix evenly over the pumpkin mixture. Follow with the rolled oats and (optional) chopped pecans.

1/2 tsp. ginger 1/4 tsp cloves

1 cup rolled oats

1 box yellow cake mix

1/2 cup chopped pecans (optional)

1/2 cup melted butter (I used 1 cup)

- 5. Drizzle the melted butter evenly over the top.
- 6. Bake for 50-60 minutes, or until the top is golden brown and a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean.
- 7. Serve warm or cool with a dollop of whipped cream.
- **STUFFING MUFFINS**



INGREDIENTS:

2 tbsp. Extra Virgin Olive Oil 1/2 c. salted butter

- 4 stalks celery, chopped
- 1 lg onion, chopped
- 2 apples peeled and chopped
- 1 cup dried cranberries
- 2 Tbsp fresh sage, chopped

2 tsp fresh thyme, chopped
1 tsp fresh rosemary, chopped
1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
1/4 tsp ground nutmeg
1/2 tsp kosher salt
1/4 tsp freshly cracked black pepper
1/4 c fresh parsley leaves, chopped
12-ox bag herb seasoned cubed stuffing
2-3 cups chicken or turkey stock

A fun way to enjoy your holiday stuffing. These are easy to make

ahead of time to save time and oven space on the big holiday!

- DIRECTIONS
- 1. Heat olive oil and butter over medium-high heat in large skillet. Add celery and onions, cooking until the onions are browned and translucent. Add all other ingredients EXCEPT the stuffing cubes and stock. Cook 1-2 minutes, stirring, then turn off heat. Add stuffing cubes and stir gently. Add 2 cups of stock, stirring until softened and moist. If making ahead, you can cover and refrigerate, otherwise continue.
- 2. Preheat oven to 375. Gently stir mixture and add more broth as needed, depending on how soft you like your stuffing.
- 3. Butter a 12-muffin tin generously. Divide stuffing mixture evenly into the cups. Bake 10-15 minutes or until nicely browned on top. Serve hot out of the over or allow to cool, if desired. They can be reheated.
