In large bowl cream butter, sugars, and vanilla until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and orange zest. Combine flour, baking soda and salt; gradually add to creamed mixture and mix well. Stir in chips. Drop by rounded tablespoonfuls, 2 inches apart onto uncreased baking sheets. Bake until golden brown (10-12 minutes) Remove to wire racks to cool. 1 cookie; 91 calories
