She was an avid collector of Hummels which began when she was in Germany.

Proposed Changes to Missouri State Campers Association Constitution and Bylaw

At the Missouri State Campers Association (MSCA) Fall meeting held on September 21, 2024 it was suggested that the term of officers be changed to two years in length. I volunteered to do a bit of research in come up with recommendations for changes to the MSCA Constitution and Bylaws. After some research I sent my recommendations to MSCA President Linda Van de Riet for her approval. She gave the okay. Next step was to send it on for approval. Since we currently do not have a State or Regional Director it was sent to FCRV Vice President of Operations, Linda English, for her approval. She gave a thumbs up. With all that said the MSCA Board of Directors can now vote on the suggestions. I know this seems a bit awkward but the changes had to be approved by the VP-Ops to insure they complied with all FCRV regulation. So, With all that being said, the suggested changes are shown below. In writing this proposal I split the five elected positions into two groups - even years and odd years - so that we would only be voting for a portion of the officers each year. This was done to try to insure some continuity in the Board of Directors. Please be prepared to ask questions about this during the meeting. I will have copies for distribution.

Recommendations for changes to Missouri State Campers Association Constitution and Bylaws.

Article II. Section 1. Currently reads:

Section 1. MSCA is an Affiliate Chartered Association of the National Campers and Hikers Association, Inc, hereinafter called NCHA, and is recognized as an association of chapters within the State of Missouri by NCHA.

Changed to:

Section 1. MSCA is an Affiliate Chartered Association of the National Campers and Hikers Association, Inc, (dba Family Campers and RVers) hereinafter called FCRV, and is recognized as an association of chapters within the State of Missouri by FCRV.

Article IX. Section 1: currently reads:

Section 1. All officers shall be elected by plurality vote for a term of one year, or until their successors are elected and qualify.

Changed to:

Section 1. All officers shall be elected by plurality vote for a term of two years, or until their successors are elected and qualify.

Section 3. Currently reads: Removed

Change to:

The President, Second Vice President, and Recording Secretary shall be elected in even years. The First Vice President and Treasurer shall be elected in the odd years.

In addition, all occurrences of the term NCHA shall be replaced with the term FCRV.

Pre-Camping Essential Camper Checklist

We are all probably thinking about getting ready - we've made reservations and are looking forward to getting on the road. But BEFORE we go there are a couple of things that should be done.

We don't have the luxury of having our camper at our home, so we are taking it to a local campground to get it ready.

- Run water through all the water lines to clear out air and anti-freeze
- Sanitize your fresh water holding tank.
- Check your water pump
- Check both heat and air conditioning
- Open all the windows and let it air out.
- Before you start stocking it is a great time for a deep clean.
- When you do start packing, distribute the weight evenly.
- Do all the doors and cabinets latch securely?
- Check your tires for wear and correct pressure. How old are they?
- Lug nuts on good and tight? Not too tight!
- Lights all working? (Turn signals, running lights, etc.) No one to help determine the lights are working? Turn on your hazard lights and check. Or drive to a business with a glass front and back up so you can see your lights in the window.
- Is there any loose trim?
- Are safety chains/cables in good shape?
- Test your generator.
- Change or clean any filters
- Check your propane level.
- How are those windshield wipers?

These are just a few ideas to get you started. You probably have your own checklist with more on it than this, but like I said, this is just to get your started.



Fall MSCA campout in Danville, Missouri is followed by a Slow Travelers campout in Belleview, Missouri. Belleview is located just North of Johnson's Shut-In and Taum Sauk Mountain State Parks, which are in the St. Francois Mountains. Taum Sauk Mountain is the highest natural point in Missouri. One can hike, or drive, to the peak of Taum Sauk where an easily accessible picnic area and panoramic view over the area's hills, valleys and rocky glades can be enjoyed. Johnson's Shut-Ins were formed by volcanoes erupting molten ash that cooled, quickly forming the hard rocks of the shut-ins. When the magma chambers of the volcano were emptied, the space collapsed into calderas (large depressions) which "shut in" the waters from the East Fork Black River. The nearby Village of Caledonia is a National Historic District. Caledonia was also home of Congressman William Vandiver who popularized the nick name "Show Me State".

With so much to explore, good friends and evening campfires make the adventures even more special.
