Where is KCA headed?

The Kansas Campers Association KCA was organized in the early stages of the National Campers & Hikers Association NCHA to provide leadership to the organized camping movement. At one time there were 135 different chapters just in Kansas and several 1,000 members. Wow what an organization! There was a scholarship program, a large youth & Teen program, a conservation program, a legislative program, a walk/hiking program, a disaster awareness program, all active and there were committee chairman for each and they were very active.

Today almost all of the programs are dormant and the chapter count has dwindled to 6. The Membership has dropped to less than 100. The Big question "Where is KCA headed?" From the history it appears to be going dormant just like all of the programs that were described earlier.

KCA currently has \$5,818.14 in a Scholarship fund, \$4,537.41 in General checking and \$15,911.59 in a money market. All at the Lyndon State Bake in Lyndon, Kansas. KCA also owns a quality PA System with 4 wireless Mic's and 2 very good speakers plus a trailer full of games, coolers, coffee pots, flags, signs and miscellaneous stuff. What will happen to this stuff and money if KCA continues on its current course and goes dark or closes. To get your answer go to the by-laws and read Article 15.

Currently KCA is operating with a Board that has asked to be replaced but no one will step up and accept any of the leadership rolls. An election is coming this year, it is your duty to step up and try to get elected to keep KCA functioning.

To me the current Board is ready to close and send all of the assets and money to the FCRV Scholarship Fund. DO YOU REALY WANT THAT?

What is your answer? Think about it and step up and help KCA to continue.


