Environmental protections are made by ordinary people who choose to act.
Earth Day is more than a social media moment.
Awareness without action doesn't save the planet.

Small actions make a difference.

Here are some suggestions that you can help the health of our planet.

1. **Join or organize a local cleanup.** Earthday.org has a global cleanup map to help your find clean-up drives in your area. Spend some time cleaning up litter. You will not only help the Earth, but you may make new friends!
2. **Optimize your thermostat.** By regulating the amount of energy used to heat or cool your home, you can decrease the carbon emissions generated by power plants. It is suggested to aim for 68 degrees in the winter and 78 degrees in the winter.
3. **Reduce disposables and opt for reusables.** Consider using stainless steel water bottles instead of plastic, use canvas bags for shopping, bring your own reusable coffee cups.
4. **Wash cold and hang dry.** 90% of washing machine energy is spent on heating the water, not cleaning your clothes. Cold water is gentler on your fabrics and helps them last longer. (Consider also turning off the heat drying feature on your dishwasher)
5. **Reduce food waste.** The USDA estimates a family of four throws away roughly \$1500 worth of food every year. Suggestions to reduce this include "shopping your pantry before you shop the store." (Use what you already have). If you have a yard, composting recycles the scraps to useable soil enhancements instead of atmospheric gasses.
6. **Reduce driving in favor of walking or biking.** For quick and shorter-distance trips, walk or bike instead of driving. That not only cuts emissions and reduces gas costs, but the exercise and fresh air may reduce stress as well!
7. **Plant something... plant anything!** Planting trees helps absorb CO₂, reduces urban heat, and supports biodiversity. Many organizations ask for volunteers to help with community greenspace development. But even on a smaller scale, you can improve your environment by growing herbs on a windowsill or flowers in a small garden or in a pot on your porch or balcony.

Obviously, these are only a small sample of things you can personally do to help the planet survive. But they are a start. One day of action changes nothing, though, but making these changes a habit and multiplying that effort by many concerned people will make a difference. The suggestions above cost very little. What will YOU do?

Recipes worth Sharing



EASY MARINATED SALAD

INGREDIENTS

SALAD

- 2 (15 oz) can green bean, drained
- 2 (15 oz) can sweet corn, drained
- 2 (15 oz) cans green peas, drained
- 1 (2 oz) jar pimentos with oil
- 2 stalks celery, finely diced.
- 1/2 white onion, diced
- 1 green bell pepper, diced

DRESSING

- 3/4 c granulated sugar
- 3/4 c white wine vinegar
- 1/2 c olive oil
- 1 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp black pepper
- 1/2 tsp onion powder

DIRECTIONS

1. In a small bowl, whisk together all dressing ingredients until well combined.
2. In a large bowl, add all salad ingredients.
3. Pour dressing over the salad ingredients. Toss until all are well coated.
4. Cover and chill for 8 hours or overnight, stirring after a few hours.
5. Serve chilled.

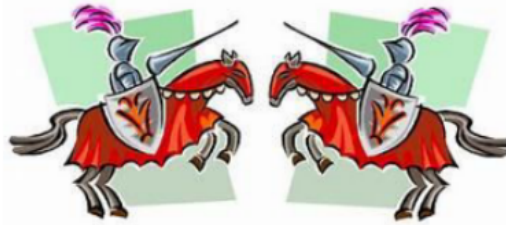

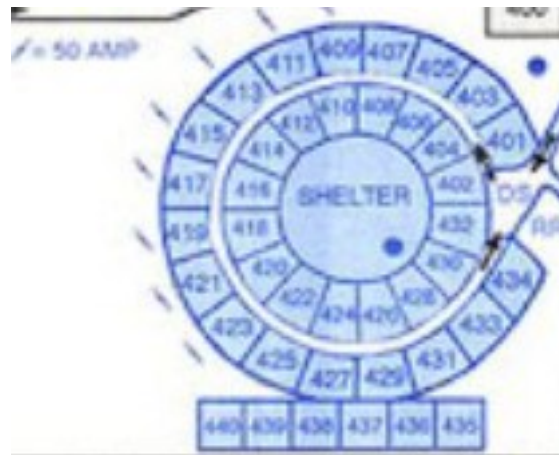

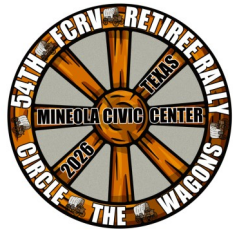
