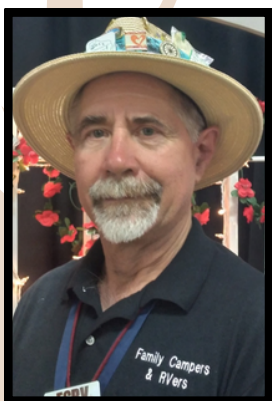

FRIENDS OF MAGA TA-HOHPI



Friends of Maga Ta-Hohpi is a private, non-profit cooperating association working with the Huron Wetland Management District of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service. Their mission is to support environmental education and promote awareness of the value of wetlands, grasslands, and wildlife habitat in the prairie pothole region.

Friends of Maga Ta-Hohpi helps connect people of all ages with nature through educational programming, volunteer efforts, and outreach centered on the 2,200-acre Maga Ta-Hohpi Waterfowl Production Area near Huron, South Dakota. The area provides opportunities for birding, photography, walking, and outdoor learning, while encouraging stewardship of natural resources.

FCRV is partnering with Friends of Maga Ta-Hohpi because of their shared commitment to outdoor education, family engagement, and meaningful recreation experiences. FCRV will be participating in both on-grounds and off-grounds activities with them all week, helping provide hands-on programs and opportunities for campers to learn, explore, and connect with the outdoors.

For the Maga Ta-Hohpi site visits, please remember to bring water, bug spray, and sunscreen. Also, keep in mind that the trains can comfortably accommodate only 20–30 passengers at a time. Staff have stressed the importance of arriving early, as all three tours will depart on schedule and will not wait for late arrivals.

RULES



- Pets must be on leashes at all times. No pets in the buildings and please clean up after them.
- No smoking or vaping in the buildings.
- FCRV acknowledges and respects the rights of individuals to use alcohol in a legal and responsible manner, just as it acknowledges and respects the rights of individuals who choose not to use alcohol. Responsible, mature behavior is expected.
- No illegal drugs.
- Please wear name tags at all times.
- Youth should wear ID bracelets at all times.
- Teens should carry their Teen Card with them at all times.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires allowed. All fires must be in enclosed fire pits and elevated off the ground. Fire rules are subject to local fire bans.

- Bike riding is allowed after dark only if you have a headlight and reflectors. No bike riding is allowed in the Buildings or high pedestrian traffic areas.
- Curfew: Unless accompanied by an adult.
Youth: 10:00pm.
Teens: 1:00am.
- Quiet Hours: From 10:00pm to 7:00am.
- Vehicles should use the MAIN entrance ALL WEEK to come and go from the campgrounds
- In the event of severe weather, please proceed to the nearest brick structure.





GLOSSARY OF TERMS



Adult & Family Center - A place for everyone to gather and play board games, puzzles, and chat.

Adult Games - Yard games for friendly competition among adults.

Aluminum Tabs - Soda pop tops collected for charity.

Announcements - A time before evening entertainment where updates, changes, and general information is given.

Bulletin Boards - Multiple locations where changes to the days schedule are posted.

C.A.M.P./C.A.M.P. Walk - A series of exercises/events scheduled to get Campers Actively Moving (Program)

Campvention - Official term for the legal meeting required annually and hosted by a different region each year.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS



Campvention Office - A central location for clerical activities. Staffed through the day by volunteers. A helpful resource for information.

Central Registration - The place to stop, after you are parked, for the actual campout. You will receive your registration packet. You can sign up for all volunteer opportunities, crafts, pump out services, etc. This is a one stop “shop” for anything that needs to be prepaid so bring check/cash for payment.

Chapters - The term for individual clubs within FCRV. Members can be members of multiple chapters. Non-chapter members are called Members-At-Large.

Closing Ceremonies - The closing of Campvention. A time to thank those who worked the current Campvention and to introduce the next year’s team. A hospitality is usually hosted by the next year’s team.

Youth - Any attendee between the ages of 0-12.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS



Commercial Area - A designated area where businesses come to sell, or promote, their products. Some vendors may offer special ordering so come early, and often, and support our vendors.

Conservation - A program of FCRV that brings awareness to the plights of the areas in which we live and camp. Campvention is the only time to raise funds for conservation by holding a raffle, 50/50, or an auction.

Crafts - Creative activities for adults unless specified otherwise.

DASAT - Disaster And Safety Awareness Training - an FCRV program focused on knowledge, prevention, and preparedness for a variety of disasters, both personal and wide scale.

Entertainment - Usually held in the evening. Could be paid local entertainers or FCRV members.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS



Evening Program - Activity that occurs after dinner. Mostly some form of entertainment but can be meetings, games, raffles, etc.

FCRV - Family Campers & RVers. An international organization established in 1949 as National Campers & Hikers to promote fun, friendship, and fellowship for all ages, and styles, of camping. Its motto is: Where strangers become friends and friends become family.

FFCC - Family and Friends Camping Club- An organization merged with FCRV as their own chartered national chapter.

Food Bank - An opportunity for attendees to donate to a local food bank.

General Membership Meeting - A yearly meeting that all members can attend.

NCHA - Organization's original name - National Campers & Hikers Association began doing business as Family Campers & RVers in 1992.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS



Goodie Bags - Bags filled with local information, free items, and Campvention information given out at central registration.

Hospitality - An evening event when States, Provinces, Regions, Chapters, or Groups welcome attendees with a snack, beverage, or souvenir. The Hospitality social is a traditional way of greeting old friends or meeting new friends and trading trinkets.

Locator Board - A centralized area with cards showing where campers are parked.

Marketplace - A place where members can sell their items to other members.

Name Tags - Are available on grounds. They should be worn at all times during Campvention to show that you belong there and for ease of personal interaction. It is also good to wear offsite to show local businesses that we are in the area and supporting them.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS



Noise Parade - Unscheduled event that can happen at any time. It is good natured fun that can be held for celebration, or for no reason at all. Any group can hold one, but local noise ordinances need to be observed. When you hear one, grab any noise making instrument and join in.

Opening Ceremonies - The welcoming start of Campvention week that is usually followed by a hospitality hosted by the Campvention team.

Region - A set group of states, or provinces, that work together for the betterment of FCRV. They may host campouts in their state, or region and work together when their area is the host of Campvention.

Seminars - Educational opportunities on varied subjects offered at Campvention.

Youth Center - Area designated for youth activities, including games, crafts, and outdoor fun.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS



State/Provincial Associations - A unit that contains all the member chapters of an individual state or province.

Teen - Any attendee between the ages of 13-19. They have their own location on grounds and a program designed for them. Attendees from other age groups can only participate by invitation.

Teen Center - The location where the teens gather.

Trade Trinkets - Small items that are traded between members. Usually done while standing in the hospitality line. The items should have a safety pin, or other way, to attach to lanyards, hats, etc.

Tram - On grounds transportation within the Campvention that is volunteer operated. Tram stops are located throughout the campsites and run on a regular schedule.

Trustees - The governing body of FCRV.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS



Vendors - Businesses that contract with FCRV to promote or sell their products at our Campvention.



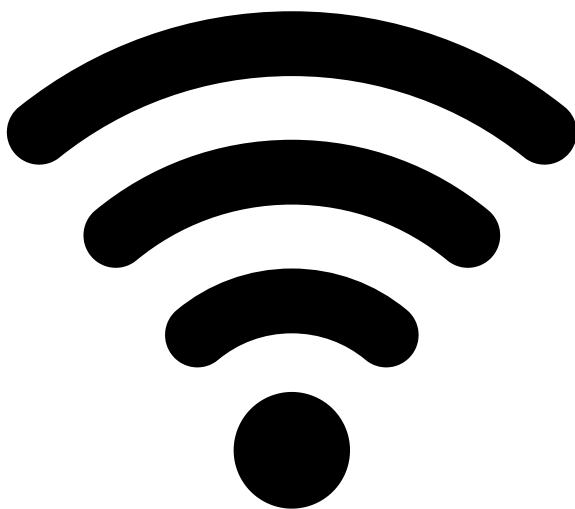
INTERNET CAFE



An Internet Cafe is available for all to use while the Nordby Hall is open. This internet service is available for surfing the internet and checking email. The password is indicated on the tables.

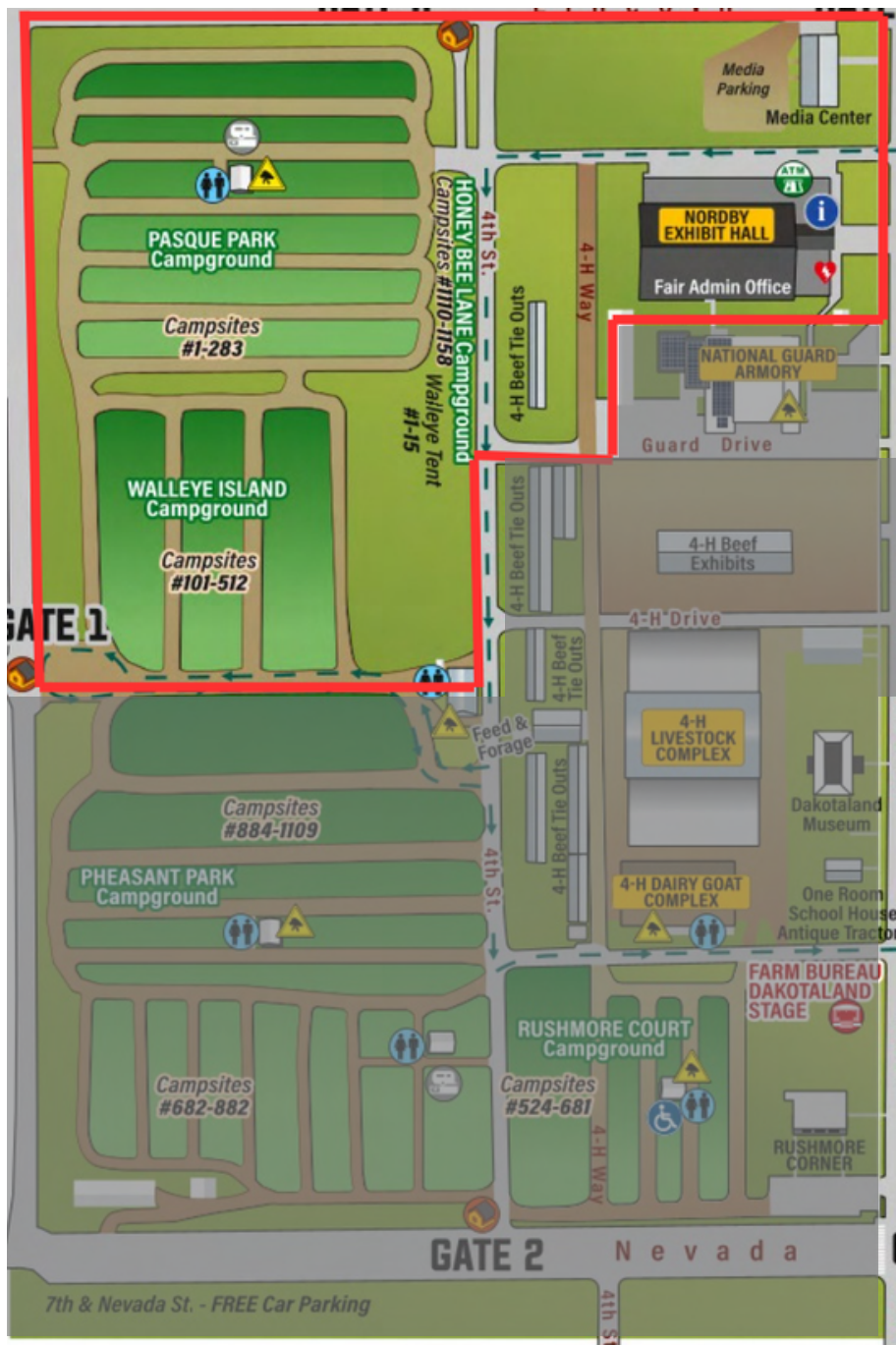

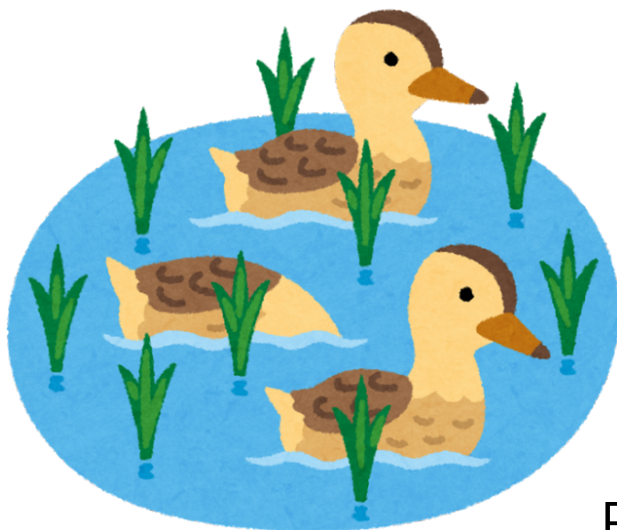

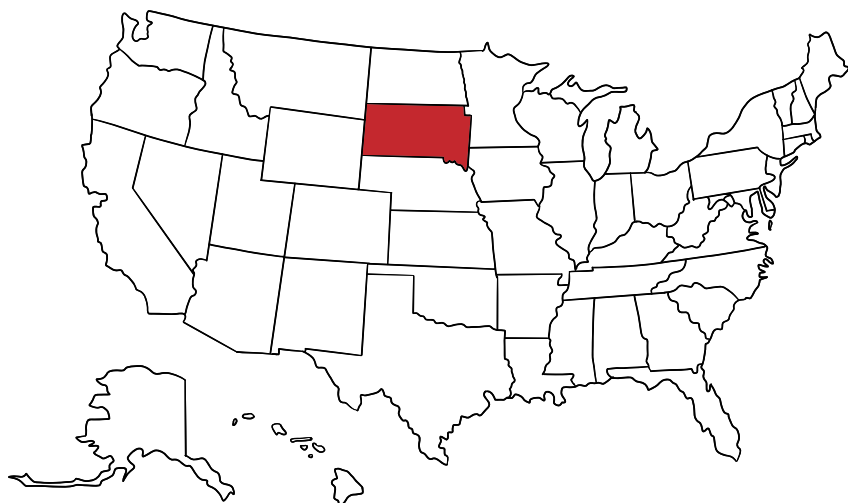


HOSPITALITY

TEEN CENTER



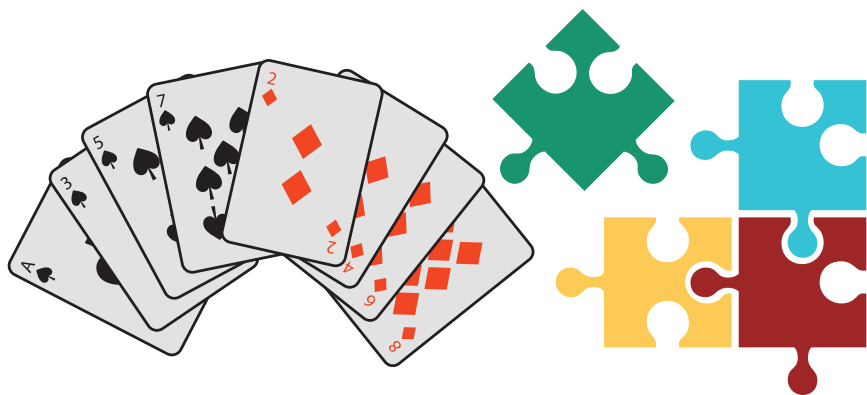

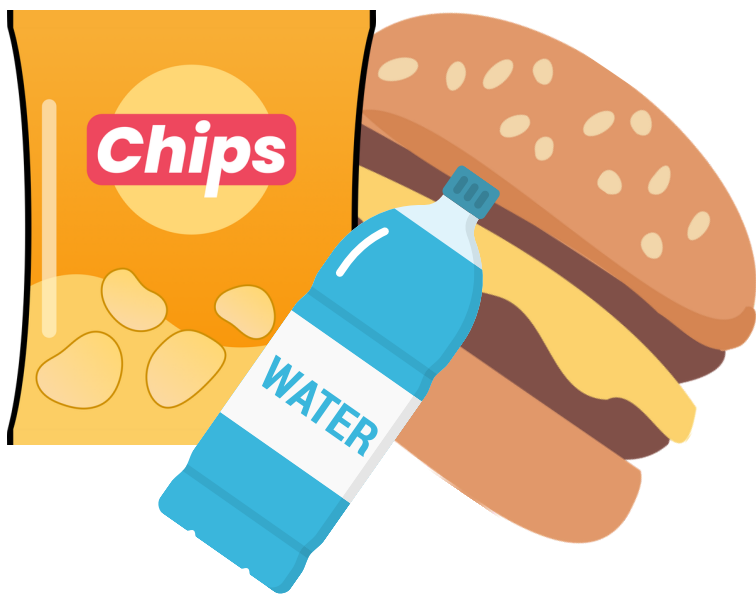
Sign-up sheets will be available at registration to help estimate participation numbers. However, signing up is not required to participate, and it does not reserve or restrict entry.

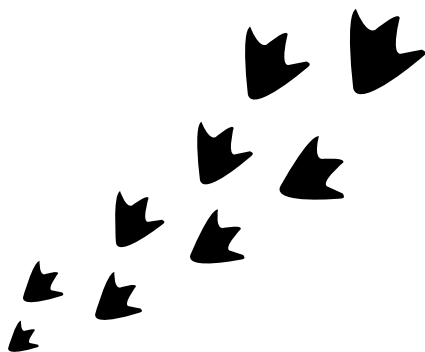


C.A.M.P.

What is it, and what does it do at Campvention?

Come out and support your fellow FCRV members. Lots of handmade items from baby booties to blankets to stuffed animals. We have very talented members, come see what they can do!





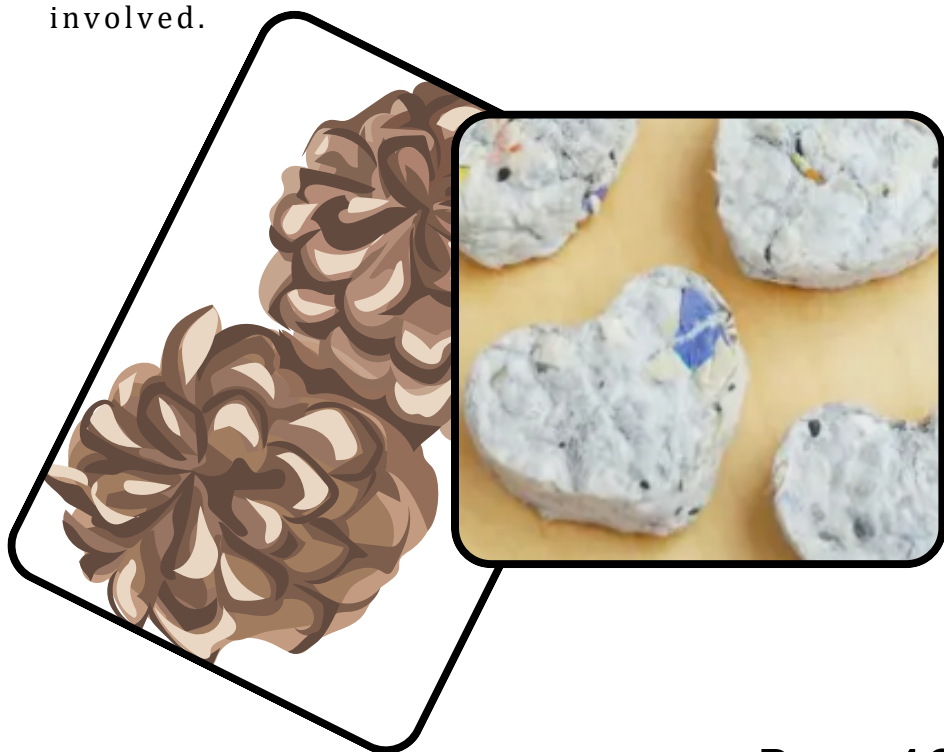
CRAFTS
