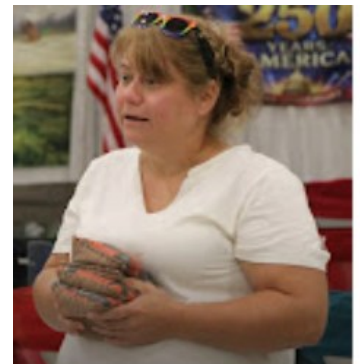
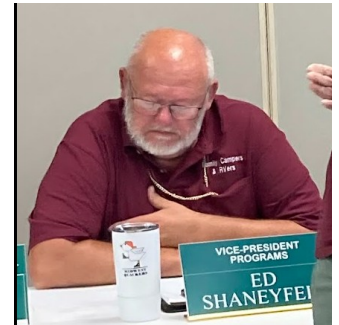
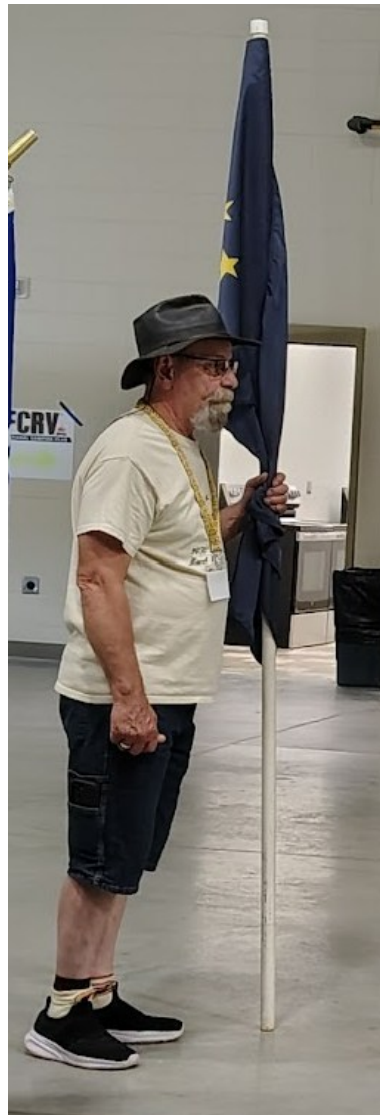

# Safe Travels as School Restarts

*This information is taken directly from the website of the National Safety Council.*

School days bring congestion: School buses are picking up their passengers, kids on bikes are hurrying to get to school before the bell rings, harried parents are trying to drop their kids off before work. It's never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when kids are present – especially before and after school.

## If You're Dropping Off

Schools often have very specific drop-off procedures for the school year. Make sure you know them for the safety of all kids. The following apply to all school zones:

- Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles
- Don't load or unload children across the street from the school
- Carpool to reduce the number of vehicles at the school

## Sharing the Road with Young Pedestrians

According to research by the National Safety Council, most of the children who lose their lives in bus-related incidents are 4 to 7 years old, and they're walking. They are hit by the bus, or by a motorist illegally passing a stopped bus. A few precautions go a long way toward keeping children safe:

- Don't block the crosswalk when stopped at a red light or waiting to make a turn, forcing pedestrians to go around you; this could put them in the path of moving traffic
- In a school zone when flashers are blinking, stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the cross-

walk or intersection

- Always stop for a school patrol officer or crossing guard holding up a stop sign
- Take extra care to look for children in school zones, near playgrounds and parks, and in all residential areas
- Don't honk or rev your engine to scare a pedestrian, even if you have the right of way
- Never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians
- Always use extreme caution to avoid striking pedestrians wherever they may be, no matter who has the right of way

## Sharing the Road with School Buses

If you're driving behind a bus, allow a greater following distance than if you were driving behind a car. It will give you more time to stop once the yellow lights start flashing. It is illegal in all 50 states to pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children.

- Never pass a bus from behind – or from either direction if you're on an undivided road – if it is stopped to load or unload children
- If the yellow or red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic must stop
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough back to allow them space to safely enter and exit the bus
- Be alert; children often are unpredictable, and they tend to ignore hazards and take risks

## Sharing the Road with Bicyclists

On most roads, [bicyclists have the same rights and responsibilities as vehicles](#), but bikes can be hard to see. Children riding bikes create special problems for drivers because usually they are not able to properly determine traffic conditions. **The most common cause of collision is a driver turning left in front of a bicyclist.**

- When passing a bicyclist, proceed in the same

direction slowly, and leave 3 feet between your car and the cyclist

- When turning left and a bicyclist is approaching in the opposite direction, wait for the rider to pass
- If you're turning right and a bicyclist is approaching from behind on the right, let the rider go through the intersection first, and always use your turn signals
- Watch for bike riders turning in front of you without looking or signaling; children especially have a tendency to do this
- Be extra vigilant in school zones and residential neighborhoods
- Watch for bikes coming from driveways or behind parked cars
- Check side mirrors before opening your door. By exercising a little extra care and caution, drivers and pedestrians can co-exist safely in school zones.

# Black Pine Animal Sanctuary



Black Pine Animal Sanctuary is located on 18 acres in Albion, Indiana (northwest of Ft. Wayne, Indiana). It is the forever home to over 80 captive exotic and wild animals who for various reasons cannot be returned to the wild. Created 23 years ago, the Sanctuary is accredited by the Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries. It does not buy, sell, trade, or breed animals, but provides refuge for the rest of the natural lives of the "residents."

The Black Pine Sanctuary hosts a Primate House, Reptile House, and Avian building. It has habitats for small mammals, bears, cats (including tigers, cougars, bobcats), wolves, foxes, and ratites (large flightless birds.) The animals are endangered species, former pets, and even animals rescued internationally.

Black Pine Sanctuary is open for exploring on

Thursdays and Fridays from 1:00-5:00, and provides staff guided tours on Saturdays and Sundays (tour times are noted on their website.) Special shortened tours are available on Fridays for children 7 years and under and for senior guests. The Sanctuary season for guests runs from May through October.

Thanks to submissions by Angie Shaneyfelt, Black Pine Animal Sanctuary has received several \$1000 grants from the FCRV Wildlife fund to assist in the maintenance and operation of this very unique enterprise. Thank you to Angie for her applications and to the Wildlife fund for providing support for such a worthwhile cause!

# Recipes worth Sharing

## Monte Cristo Sliders

### INGREDIENTS:

- 12 Hawaiian rolls
- 12 ham slices
- 12 turkey slices
- Sliced Swiss and/or Cheddar Cheese (24 slices)
- 1/3 c salted butter, melted
- 1 egg
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1 tbsp powdered sugar

### DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray 9x1 pan with non-stick spray. Slice the whole package of rolls (without separating them). Place the bottom halves of the rolls into the prepared baking pan.
2. Place half of the cheese slices into the rolls, then layer on all the ham, all of the turkey, and the other half of the cheese slices. Place the top halves of the rolls back on top.
3. In a small bowl, whisk together the melted butter, the egg, and the pepper. Brush this mixture over the sliders.
4. Bake for 25 minutes (until the cheese is melted and buns toasted.) If buns start browning too soon, cover loosely with aluminum foil.
5. After the buns are done baking in the oven, remove and sprinkle on a little bit of powdered sugar.
6. Optionally, serve with jam or maple syrup.



## Cucumber Salad

### INGREDIENTS

- 1 cucumber, sliced thin.
- 2 medium tomatoes, chopped (or halved cherry tomatoes)
- 1 small red onion, thinly sliced.
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 2 tbsp red wine vinegar
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- Salt and pepper to taste.
- Fresh parsley, optional for garnish.

### DIRECTIONS:

1. Salt the sliced cucumber and allow to set for 15 minutes. Soak the sliced red onion in cold water for 15 minutes. Drain both.
2. In a large bowl, combine the sliced cucumber, chopped tomatoes and sliced red onion.
3. In a separate bowl, whisk together the olive oil, red wine vinegar, oregano, salt and pepper.
4. Pour the dressing over the vegetables and toss to combine.
5. Let the salad sit for about 10 minutes to allow the flavors to marinate.
6. Garnish with parsley, if desired, and serve chilled or at room temperature.





# Rest in Peace

## Freddie Ray Lane

MAY 29, 1947 - JULY 20, 2026

Freddie was born on May 29, 1947, in Marshall, Texas, to Ned and Fannie Mae (Harris) Lane. As the youngest of six children, he grew up surrounded by the love of a close-knit family. He graduated from Pemberton High School in Marshall, where he ran track.

Following graduation, Freddie answered the call to serve his country by enlisting in the United States Army. During his distinguished military career, he served as a combat paratrooper in the Vietnam War, earning numerous honors and medals. Later in his career, he served as a legal specialist and spent over a decade stationed in Germany. Whether walking along a beach in Mexico, discovering a new city, or simply enjoying a card game by the campfire, Freddie found joy in exploring the world alongside Terry. He was an avid

sports fan who especially cherished camping and fishing trips with his grandchildren, creating memories they will treasure forever.

Freddie was preceded in death by his parents, Ned and Fannie Mae Lane; his beloved son, Andre Gregory Lane; his sisters, Ruby Pearl Smith, Nettie Mae McCray, Lula Morris, and Lola Mitchell; and his brother, Eddie Clay Lane.

He is survived by his devoted wife, Theresa Marie Lane; his grandson, Andre Gregory Lane II (Letty); his stepchildren, Evelyn Morad, James Masarik (Michelle), Kathryn Brooks (Nathan), and Carrie Masarik; and thirteen grandchildren. He also leaves behind many cherished relatives, dear friends, and devoted caregivers whose kindness enriched his life. A memorial service honoring Freddie's life will be held at 11:30 a.m. on Monday, August 10, 2026, in the Remembrance Hall Chapel at Crown Hill Funeral Home and Cemetery, 700 West 38th Street, Indianapolis, Indiana. 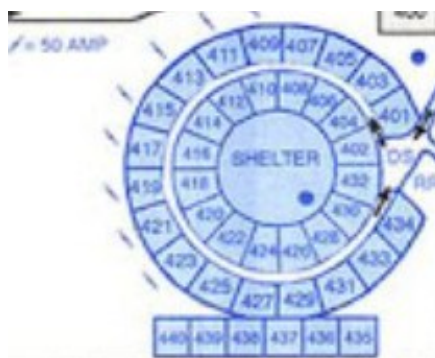

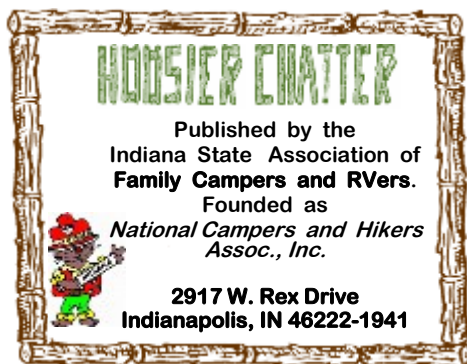
